Description:

In 2025, Sisaket Rajabhat University treated a total of **1.10 tons of inorganic non-toxic waste**, consisting of paper, soft plastic, hard plastic, and minor residual materials generated from campus activities. Compared with 2024 (1.13 tons), the total amount shows a reduction of **0.03 tons**, reflecting ongoing efforts in waste minimization and resource efficiency.

According to the university's waste management data, inorganic waste treatment in 2025 is categorized as follows:

- **Reused (0.01 tons):** mainly paper reused for internal administrative purposes such as draft documents and internal communication.
- **Down-cycled (1.08–1.09 tons):** the majority of waste, including paper (1.00 tons), soft plastic (0.01 tons), and hard plastic (0.08 tons), which are processed through recycling and material recovery systems.
- **Up-cycled (0.01 tons):** a small portion of waste is upcycled through value-added or creative reuse activities.

These waste management practices demonstrate the university's commitment to waste segregation, resource efficiency, and circular economy principles, helping to reduce landfill disposal and promote sustainable environmental management.
