Seniors

- ★ Be sure to keep checking google classroom for scholarships, they are listed as we receive them.
- ★ Be sure you're on track for your community service hours, and be sure you log them. Not only are they a graduation requirement, but you need to have them completed to participate in Senior Outing and Senior Prom.

As we get into spring and season work opportunities increase for students, please remember that you MUST have working papers in order to be hired, and you must have a letter from your potential employer in order to get them. Bring your documentation to the Counseling Office in order to receive your working papers.

ADD/DROP PROCESS FOR SEMESTER 2

All students will follow their schedule for the first 2 days of the semester (no changes on these days). Add/Drop will begin on January 25th and students must complete the add/drop google form to begin the process. Students will be able to make changes to their schedules based on semester courses only. The procedure will be as follows:

1. January 25th through January 27th

- a. All students will be able to make schedule changes.
- Students need to submit an add/drop request through a Google form to the Counseling
 Department by the end of the day January 27th. No request for changes will be accepted after the
 27th. Here is the link to the form: Add/Drop Form (link will be open at the end of the day Jan.
 24th).
- c. On January 25th counselors will begin to review all add/drop requests. After reviewing the requests, counselors will notify students of the change (students should check their email regularly

for notification). If a student's request was not able to be made the student will be notified as to the reason. If necessary, counselors will schedule a time to meet with students regarding their request.

2. Contracted Courses

All contracted courses are due to the Counseling Office (signed by the student, parent, instructor and department chair) no later than **January 27th**.

Parents/Guardians/Community Members,

The past few days have presented the country with some difficult challenges at high school sporting events. Our community is not immune. As many of you may know, there was an unfortunate incident at the Weaver High School v. Middletown High School basketball game earlier this week. There have been uncredible rumors that there will be spillover at Windsor High School's game with Middletown High School on January 24.

For the safety of everyone involved, the District will have additional police and security presence at the Middletown High School v. Windsor High School boys basketball game. The following measures will also be implemented:

- 1. Tickets will be limited to Middletown High parents and select fans and Windsor High students/parents/residents. Tickets will be sold online and at the door.
- 2. Everyone must present a form of identification prior to entering showing that they reside in Windsor or Middletown.
- 3. We will provide a livestream option for those who are interested in watching. The link will be available on WPSAthletics Youtube.

We understand these measures may cause inconvenience for some, however, the safety of our students, staff and guests is our top priority.
