ABSTRACT – Font Times New Roman 11, bold

The Abstract summarises the article's introduction, objective/ aims, research methods, results, and conclusions, allowing readers to grasp the essence of the content. It should be presented in a single paragraph using a single-column format. It should be concise, not exceeding 250 words, in "Times New Roman" font, size 11, with single spacing.

Background: Place the question addressed in a broad context. Write the research objectives concisely and clearly

Methods: basic procedures, research design, selection and size of study subjects, materials and equipment used, data analysis techniques

Results: main findings (p value, OR/ RR, CI or themes in qualitative research), and the principal conclusions.

Conclusion: Recommendations and implications of the study must be clear. It should not contain any references or displayed equations.

Keywords: 3 to 5 keywords separated by commas (,) – Font Times New Roman 11 italic and arranged alphabetically

The manuscripts are arranged in 1 column with Times New Roman font, size 11, with single spacing.

INTRODUCTION – Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

The introduction includes the background, research objectives, and literature review, organized without subheadings. A series of stories highlighting the key issues raised in this research should be presented. The issues should be objective (addressed by researchers in respected journals or reported by reputable research institutions, not by the authors). The introduction also outlines the research objectives or the purpose of the paper. Each new paragraph should be indented 5 spaces. The font is Times New Roman, size 11, with single spacing.

RESEARCH METHOD– Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

There is an explanation of how (unique, specific, detailed) the data or information was collected, which is accountable to the research objectives and results (traceable). The research methods, study location and durations, population and sample, instruments, data analysis techniques have been presented carefully and understandably. The description should be concise and clear, using Times New Roman font, size 11, with single spacing.

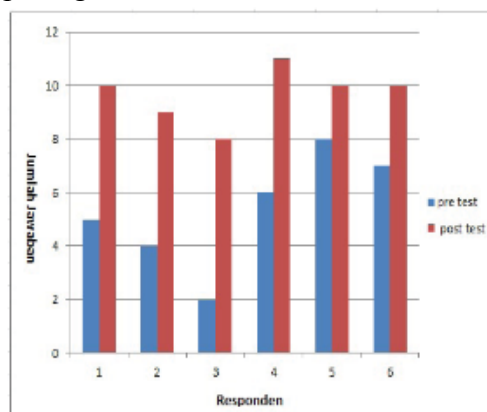
RESULTS– Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

The results should be written directly without being separated into distinct sections. The results may be presented in the form of tables and graphs. The description should be in Times New Roman font, size 11, with single spacing.

DISCUSSION- Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

The discussion should be written directly without repeating the detailed results of the research. The discussion of the research includes a discussion of the research results and comparisons with theories and/or similar research. The research discussion contains a discussion of research results and comparisons with theories and or similar research. The discussion should include the contributions and impacts of the research. The authors provide arguments for the claimed research findings, providing logical cause-and-effect explanations and constructing a “new story.” The description should be in Times New Roman font, size 11, with single spacing.

CONCLUSION-Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

The first section of the conclusion presents the most important findings from the discussion that answer the research objectives in one paragraph. The description should be in Times New Roman font, size 11, with single spacing.

RECOMMENDATIONS-Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

Recommendations should be written in paragraphs. Recommendations contain instructions/opportunities for further research for future researchers, using Times New Roman, size 11, with single spacing.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS (IF ANY)-Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

You may include the names of individuals or organizations that assisted with or funded the research.

REFERENCES Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold

References should be formatted using reference management systems (such as Mendeley, Zotero, and Endnote) and arranged according to APA 6th (American Psychological Association) style. References are taken from reputable and up-to-date journals, at least from the last 10 years and some of them from the last 3 years. A minimum of 20 references is required.
