## **Pastor Megan's Peaceful Ponderings**

Freedom means a lot to me as an American, and each year around July 4th I find myself thinking about what it means to be a free person, and more importantly, what it means to be a free Christian.

Freedom is defined in the Oxford dictionary as "the power or right to act, speak, or think as one wants without hindrance or restraint." This sounds pretty good, until we start looking at it a little more closely. What is restraining or hindering us? What is empowering us? What does it truly be to be free of hindrance or restraint? And perhaps most importantly of all, what should be done with this absolut freedom? Put another way, we need to consider what we are freed from, and what we are freed for! These are BIG questions, and led us to ponder some frightening ideas.

As is so often the case, we can turn to our faith for answers. After all, we aren't the first people to ask these questions. Paul was wondering about them when he wrote to the Galatians saying "For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters, only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become enslaved to one another." Galatians 5:13. He was also thinking about it as he wrote to the Corinthians saying "For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might gain all the more." 1 Cor 9:19. Martin Luther had read Paul's writings and referred to them when he wrote *Freedom of a Christian* in 1520. One of the things Luther realized Christians are free from is rational limitations... and thus he wrote that "A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject to all" A statement that sounds like it contradicts each other, but actually perfectly sums up what freedom is for Christians.

Looking at these authors we gain insight into these questions. Both Paul and Luther thought that we were freed from the law. The practice of trying to live a life according to God's rules so that we would earn salvation. It was freedom from trying to earn God's love... and in being set free from this, we were also set free from many other things.

Free from fear because we lived in the promise of God's love

Free from doing good works to earn God's love, because God has already claimed us in love Free from judgement because God had claimed us in love Free from sin because we could repent and be forgiven by our loving God Free from death because God in his love for us was always making us new

This freedom opens up all kinds of doors for us... and we can be tempted to go too far with it. We can think that because we are free from sin we are free from consequence, and that our actions good or bad have no meaning. Or we can think that because we are free from doing good work that we no longer have responsibilities, and that we don't need to care about our brothers and sisters.

This kind of freedom is not a gift, and I don't believe that God is offering us this kind of freedom. Honestly, I don't believe God intended us to ever be free from consequence or responsibility at all. We can look at what Jesus did throughout the Gospels for proof of this. When Jesus healed someone and set them free from the injury, demon, or wound binding them, he sent them out to tell others about how they had been set free. When facing crucifixion, Jesus gave up his freedom and allowed himself to be bound by the rules and laws of our world, and showed us that God was truly free from all these laws, and earthly certainties, even death. Finally in the resurrection Jesus free from death, does not free the disciples from the responsibilities that came from following him. Jesus sent them out, empowered, equipped, and set free by the Holy Spirit to share the Good News with the world. You see, freedom for a Christian is all about understanding that God does not just set us free FROM something, God also sets us free FOR something!

That means; We are freed from fear so that we can be bold in sharing God's love We are freed from earning God's love so that we can use that time and energy to love our neighbors... because as Martin Luther believed, God does not need your good works, but your neighbor does! We are free from judgement so that we can be more accepting and curious about others, moving beyond our shame and opening our hearts and minds to learn about others. We are freed from sin and forgiven so that we can be forgiving of others when they repent, allowing each other to make mistakes, deal with the consequences of those mistakes, and then move forward beyond them.

Finally we are freed from death so that we can live lives of mercy, hope, grace, and love in the here and now, and trust that ALL things will be put right in God's time.

This is what freedom means to me as a Christian. It means that I have been set free from the cycle of shame, doubt, hatred, fear, sin and death, so that I can live, proudly sharing God's love, finding healing for past mistakes, and boldly moving forward with hope that is rooted in God's promise. As we celebrate the freedom of our country this July, I invite you to ponder the freedom that God has given you, to think, pray and give thanks to God for the things you have been freed FROM, and wonder about and ask God to guide you in the work that you have been freed FOR!

They do this by training health volunteers to monitor child development, promote nutrition and hygiene, monitor blood pressure and blood sugar, promote cancer screenings, help support those with HIV / AIDs, and speak out against domestic abuse. To fully fund this ministry the church in Honduras would need \$20,000 a year, currently our synod is able to provide them with \$17,000. Each gift you give to this month's F.O.M. helps make that \$17,000 possible, and helps us move closer to fully funding this ministry! Thank you for your gifts!
