Week 1

Introduction to Revelation

Read Revelation Chapter 1

Focus Theme: Understanding the purpose and structure of Revelation

Key points:

- Revelation as a letter, prophecy, and apocalyptic literature
- The centrality of Jesus in the vision
- John's circumstances in Patmos
- The blessing of reading, hearing, and keeping the words of this prophesy

Questions:

- What does it mean to you that Jesus is described as the "Alpha and Omega"?
- How does understanding the purpose of Revelation shape your approach to studying it?

Week 2

Letters to the Churches (Part 1)

Read Revelation Chapter 2

Focus Theme: Christ's call to the churches

Key Points:

- Letters to Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, and Thyatira
- Encouragement and warnings to the churches
- The relevance of these messages for churches today

Questions:

- What lessons can we learn from the praise and rebuke to these churches?
- Does this sound like Jesus in the rest of the New Testament?
- How does Christ's call to "overcome" resonate in your own life?

Week 3

Letters to the Churches (Part 2)

Read Revelation Chapter 3

Key Points:

- Letters to Sardis, Philadelphia and Laodicea
- The dangers of spiritual complacency and lukewarm faith
- The promise of eternal reward

Questions:

- Which of these letters speaks most directly to your personal faith journey?
- How can we maintain a sense of urgency and passion in our faith?

Week 4

The Throne Room of Heaven

Read Revelation Chapters 4-5

Focus Theme: Worship and the Sovereignty of God

Key Points:

- The vision of God's throne and heavenly worship
- the Lamb who is worthy to open the scroll
- Christ's redemptive work as the center of worship

Questions:

- How does the vision of worship in heaven inspire your own worship?
- What does it mean that Christ is both the Lion and the Lamb?

Week 5

The Seven Seals

Read Revelation Chapters 6-7

Focus Theme: God's judgement and redemption

Key Points:

- The opening of the first six seals and their implications
- The sealing of the 144,000
- The great multitude before God's throne

Questions:

- What stands out to you about God's protection of God's people?
- How do these chapters impact your understanding of God's justice and mercy?

Week 6

The Seven Trumpets

Read Revelation Chapters 8-11

Focus Theme: The call to repentance

Key points:

- The judgement associated with the seven trumpets
- The bittersweet scroll eaten by John
- The two witnesses and God's power over death

Questions:

- How does God use judgment as a call to repentance?
- What role does sharing the Gospel play in the midst of God's unfolding plan?

The Cosmic Conflict

Week 7

Read Revelation Chapters 12-14

Focus Theme: Christ's victory over evil

Key Points:

- The woman, the dragon and the child
- The beast from the sea and the beast from the earth
- The eternal gospel and the harvest of the earth

Questions:

- How does the cosmic conflict give perspective to struggles in your life?
- What encouragement do you find in the Lamb's ultimate victory?

Week 8

The New Heaven and New Earth

Read Revelation Chapters 21-22

Focus Theme: the promise of eternal life

Key Points:

- The new Jerusalem and God dwelling with God's people
- The end of sin, suffering and death
- The invitation to drink from the water of life

Questions:

- Does the promise of eternal life impact how you live today? If so, how?
- How can you share the hope of Revelation's message with others?

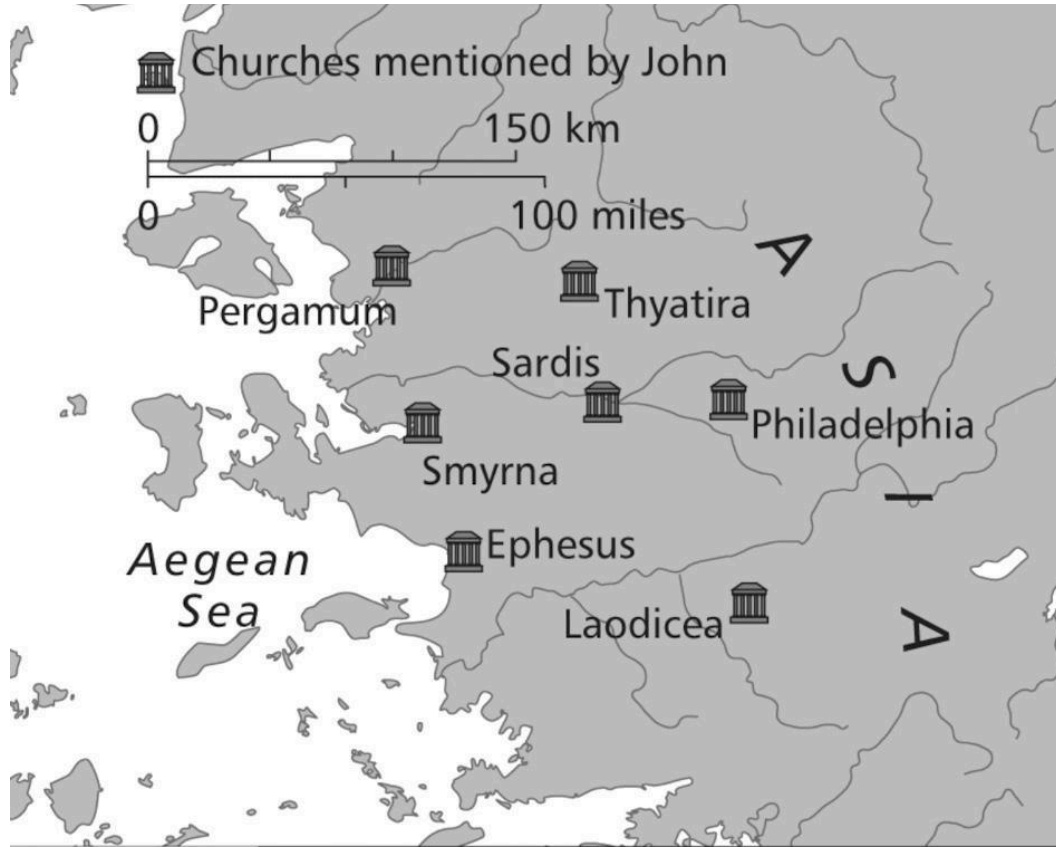
