HOW TO GET HERE

Atelier 11, Cité Falguière is located at:

11 Cité Falguière, 75015 Paris (metro Pasteur, line 12 or 6)

You can get to Atelier 11 by Uber or Taxi available at any airport and train station in Paris, or by many convenient public transportation options.

From Charles de Gaulle (CDG) airport: take the RER B train to Denfert-Rochereau station and then take line 6 metro to Pasteur station.

The RER station for Terminal 2 is right inside the terminal, but for Terminal 1 you will need to take an airport shuttle train (called CDGVal) to the RER train station. This shuttle is free and goes every 2-3 minutes. If you take a train, keep your train ticket, as you will need it not only to enter the station at the airport, but also to exit the station when in Paris.

From the ORLY airport: our advice would be to take the *OrlyBus* which goes toward the Denfert-Rochereau square right in Montparnasse, and take line 6 metro to Pasteur station.

From Gare du Nord & Gare de l'Est: take the RER B train to Denfert-Rochereau station and then take line 6 metro to Pasteur station.

From Paris Gare de Lyon: take metro line 14 one stop to Bercy station, change to line 6 towards Pasteur metro.

TRANSPORTATION

Paris Métro:

To travel by metro, bus, tram, RER train within central Paris, and even on the Funiculaire de Montmartre we advise to use Navigo Easy Pass. It can be bought at any metro station booth or machine.

The Navigo Easy pass is sold for €2 and then offers more advantageous rates on t+ ticket books. Single trip ticket costs € 1.90, but you can buy 10 rides with 25% discount, for € 14.90.

PRACTICAL TIPS

Foreign Plugs:

French voltage is 220-230 V, so a 50 Hz. U.S./ Canadian, Japanese (and perhaps some other) appliances/electric devices may require a step-down transformer for use in France. Please check if your device works in 220V. If not, and you only use an adaptor plug, your device will be damaged and probably destroyed. If in doubt, don't plug it in!

Your computer will almost certainly offer dual voltage, and will thus need only an adaptor plug. Please verify you have the right plug before plugging it in. Please arrive equipped with the necessary transformers and adaptor plugs for France. Please label your cables, plug adaptors, etc., with your name to avoid confusion over who owns what.

Cell/Mobile telephones:

It is generally a good idea to purchase a local SIM card. Before departure, please make sure your phone is unlocked and can be used abroad if you intend to do so. At the airport, you can purchase a prepaid SIM card at a Relay kiosk. There are multiple Relay locations in all Paris area airports:

When already in the city, the best place to purchase would be in companies' boutiques, for example, at various locations of Boutique Orange. (Orange is the largest French mobile operator).

Security:

Please keep your room locked if you have anything of value in it. Please do not leave cameras, computers, etc., in a public space.

ATMS, BANKS AND CURRENCY EXCHANGE

ATM Cards & Credit Cards:

Many French cash-points and commerces do not accept the common U.S. swipe-cards, but require chip-and-pin cards. Please ask your bank to issue you a chip-and-pin card for use in Europe. Note that ticket machines in train and metro stations *only* accept chip-and-pin cards.
