

Isle Public Schools Plan for E-Learning Days

In accordance with Minnesota Stat. § 120A.41, Isle Public Schools will exercise the e-learning day option should circumstances warrant an emergency school closure. An e-learning day could be prompted by issues related to weather, utilities, facilities, or staffing. The statute allows for up to five e-learning days per school year. These days will be counted as instructional days and included as hours of instruction.

Isle Public Schools ISD 473 Plan:

- PK-3rd grade students will have work assigned with instructions and resources sent home. Teachers will go over this with students prior to an e-learning day taking place. This information can also be found on teacher websites.
- 4-6th grade students will have work assigned for all classes missed. This will be available on teacher websites. Hard copy formats are in student folders. Teachers will review requirements with students prior to an e-learning day taking place when possible.
- 7-12th grade students will have work assigned for all classes scheduled for the missed day(s) available in Google Classroom depending on the requirements of each teacher and the status of a student's Internet access. Teachers will review requirements with students prior to an e-learning day taking place.
- All academic material will be preassigned or accessible to students and families by 9:00 am on a designated e-learning day.
- Teachers will be available by email and/or phone for students and families from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm.
- If a family is unable to participate or chooses not to participate on an e-learning day their child will be marked as an excused absence for that day. Parents must call in the absence in accordance with already established protocols.
- Attendance is defined as "interaction with a teacher on an instructional day," be it through an email, Google Meets, a phone call or a completed assignment. Students will be counted as present if they complete and submit required assignments.
- Parents and students in grades 4-12 must inform teachers if there is no Internet access at home so required modifications to assignments can be planned prior to an e-learning day.
- Appropriate and differentiated instruction for students with disabilities under chapter 125A that meet the needs of each student's Individual Education Plan (IEP)/504 plans will be considered.
- Students have up to 5 school days after an e-learning day takes place to turn in any work assigned on an e-learning day.
