Dear Students,

Welcome to the Preventing Sexual Misconduct Class. We will pursue two teaching objectives:

- 1. Helping you to become more emotionally intelligent within your community about personal, interpersonal and sangha dynamics
- 2. Preparing you through (legal) policy to weather a misconduct storm in your sangha.

We offer this class because the Western Buddhist community has struggled with sexual misconduct scandals for more than 50 years, and even though we have tried to set rules about teacher-student relationships, the difficulties and harm caused by offending teachers to our Buddhist communities and reputation continues.

Many people have read rules and guidelines about attraction and relationships in the Buddhist sangha. And yet, when meeting these real-life situations with OUR teacher, in OUR temple, we falter and often lose our way.. We need to understand why we become mired in complex emotions and evaluations. AND we need a map to guide us—clear policy and consequences for violation of policy. In this class we will introduce you to community members who went through this distressing ordeal so you can understand and <u>feel</u> for yourselves the roller coaster an entire community experiences when confronting sexual misconduct.

We will begin this class by introducing 3 sangha members who suffered with their community when a recent sexual affair between their teacher and one of his students was disclosed. We want you to note how you feel about their reactions and actions. Our legal counsel, Carol Merchasin, will later address how a clear policy and grievance procedure might have supported the community through this ordeal. In subsequent classes she will continue to outline the essential elements of policy, and we will also teach the council method for sharing the feelings and creating a wholesome style of communication within the sangha. In this way we will fulfill both of our teaching objectives.
