

Our proposed idea for a new emoji would be one to depict the sport of pickleball. Pickleball is one of the world's fastest growing sports and, with over 4 million players, the fastest growing in the United States. Drawing off of concepts of tennis, pickleball, the state sport of Washington state as of 2022, is played in singles or doubles on a court smaller than that of a tennis court. Originally designed for old folks, the smaller court allows for easier movement, making the game less physically demanding than tennis. Barriers such as

asthma, body deterioration, and other ailments don't pose as much of a problem on the pickleball court than they would on the tennis court. Pickleball is also has an easier barrier to entry for many prospective players as paddles are usually cheaper than tennis rackets and pickleball courts are easier to construct than tennis courts. Finally, pickleball is attractive because of its gender equitability, as professional men and women play in the same tour for an equal purse. It would be important to add a pickleball emoji because this sport provides a similar experience to tennis, while being accessibile to a much larger population.

Our new emoji is a variation of the sleeping emoji, but it represents individuals with sleep apnea, which requires them to sleep with an oxygen mask on since their lungs do not automatically breathe when they fall asleep. We included an attachment of the sample emoji below. To make this new emoji, we used the software Adobe Express. First, we google searched PNG images of the current sleep emoji (with the z's) as well as a sleep apnea face mask (also known as a CPAC).

After the acquisition of these two images, we spliced them together within the Adobe software to create the new emoji which we have presented below. There are currently no emojis that look like this.
