- It would be helpful to see where open access policies
- Canadian Museum of History: systems and tech -- massive collections -- all the good information is on index cards, stuff that we have in the systems -- we can be approached, we don't have a way to deliver it -- CMSs are proprietary -- other
 - Variety in collections
 - Our collection is ethnology, archeology, there is a point where the work -- smaller institutions that don't have staff
 - Understand how to do the work
 - Access teams of specialists who understand how to do the open access release --
 - Federal museum have limited specialized knowledge in copyright clearance, understanding the contracts that exists, writing new ones, make that leap into getting stuff out there
 - Institutions -- challenge on their own website -- need better allyship

- *Bierut*
 - *Art and Photography collections --*
 - *With these organizations its hard to find legal counsel, various contracts, how a larger -- arab image foundation, our lawyer thought that on our contracts that we could -- in fact we can't put anything online*
 - *Small organizations that have figured it out*
 - *Used rights statements*
 - *Large to small institutions,*
- *Copyright analysis -- could have taken the risk*
 - *Understanding the risk level of the organization -- project of the University of Edinburgh*
- *Panama*
 - *Copyright in the university -- national libraries is cc license they want to -- they don't have the permission of the authors -- I tried to figure out how to -- it has been really tough because CC*
 - *OpenGLAM -- trying to do a*
 - *Example of brazil is a good persuasive -- good opportunity to take that*
- *Identify actors at the local level that can provide support to local institutions -- poland ngo -- we have been working with GLAM for 5 years -- we offer support for GLAMs in poland, trainings, consultancy, -- can only do country-wise*
 - *National institute of Open Policies*
 - *On the local level -- there are other organizations*
 - *FAq*
 - *Institutions generally say that the principles are too broad and too general -- then they describe particular*
 - *Training materials with local activists --*
- *Muse IP-- very limited in its scope in the U.S.*
- *Special MCN interest*
- *Juliana from brazil*
 - *Work in the museum area -- one strategy for Brazilian context s translation -- in order to have the local people that -- we need training material in portuguese -- translation could work very well*
- *Artwork -- museums and libraries they know when they digitize they put it up as copyright material -- you can deal with the other issues -- communicating*
 - *Economic question -- museums have been living off a business model -- need to show that over the long term more eyeballs and opportunities -- not put it behind a paywall*
 - *Netherlands we asked for folks to share the revenue -- they were losing money on selling public domain material*
- *Differences in jurisdiction -- probably need to make it very clear how it applies*
- *ICOM, International on Council on Archives SPArk, Coalition of Open Access Repositories, Largest institution in that jurisdiction,*
- *Game changer in the Public Domain was the ministry -- awful struggle before -- institutions selling the high res*

- Institutions sign off on a declaration -- in Sau Paulo -- state museums are run by private organizations -- they are in the middle -- easier to sign something like this, large museum when we think outside that -- directly managed by the state --
 - Rijksmuseum because they don't have institutional by in
- Big funders that go open -- don't know if that is too a claim for open, space -- may be too much with Arcadia
- In the Flemish context that made mention of how smaller institutions could open their data, one year to another, we saw a lot more interest, they realized that we bargained at some point, apparently there is some support
- Hackathon -- first experience that is gaining a lot of momentum
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Discussion notes

- It would be helpful to see examples of institutions that don't do this properly
- A challenge for GLAMs is in the CMSes, the mass of data, the fact that a lot of valuable information is in index cards and not in databases...
 - Technical effort combined with a variety in your collections. Sometimes you will have to go item by item.
- Alex Stinson: How do you make this relevant to small institutions?
- Lack of specialized knowledge in institutions is an issue as well; understanding contracts, legislation, writing new contracts...
- Small non-profit photography collections in Beirut: for such organizations it's hard to find legal council. It would be helpful to build a network of large and small institutions who have figured certain things out, e.g. using RightsStatements instead of CC licenses where the latter is not possible.
- It would be good to be able to find similar organizations
- Documentation that answers common questions
- Panama: national library wants to release materials under CC license, but don't have permission from the authors
