While at Harrisburg his teams won 3 IHSA Class A State Championships and a total of 8 trophies. He coached 8 individual and 7 relay State Champions. His athletes have one a total of 94 State medals. Tony was named ITCCCA Coach of the Year 6 times. At Plainfield, his team won the conference in 2008, North's first graduating class. He has presented at eighteen clinics including ITCCCA's, has had published over 100,000 words promoting track and field, and currently has written 27 blogs for ITCCCA.com.
