Course title:	Te Reo Maori Year 10
Year level(s):	Level 4
Course Code:	MAO10

Goals:

The Year 10 Te Reo Māori course gives students the opportunity to use their Te Reo Māori skills to explore complex traditional and contemporary Māori issues and to prepare for Year 11 and the opportunity to work towards NCEA Level 2 and 3. The year 10 Te Reo Maori course is an extension of the topics in year 9 and develops more language skill depth.

Assessment

The four **Internal test standards** (**Aromatawai-ā-roto**) will be assessed during class time. Specific requirements for work completion will be detailed in the Test Standards issued to students. Whakarongo, Tuhinga, Panui and Korero.

Students will be given opportunities to attend cultural events and performances. At this level, they are expected to attend at least one residential immersion language course during the year.
