Espionage Act 2033

AN ACT

to

Provide for the prohibition of espionage and for criminal prosecution of such.

29 November 2033



By the grace of Emperors Nicolas and Alexander, and by the will of the Senate and People of Gaul, let it be enacted:

I Definitions

- I. “Espionage” shall refer to the sharing, distribution, collection, ownership, or viewing of classified information as per the Classified Information Act 2033.
- II. “Foreign power” shall refer to a nation other than the State of Greater Gaul.
- III. “Agent” shall refer to a person who is suspected of, or convicted of espionage under this Act.

II Espionage

- I. It shall be a crime to attempt and successfully commit espionage on the State of Greater Gaul. The punishment for committing espionage may be a fine of B100,000-1,000,000, including a prison sentence of no less than 2 months and no more than life imprisonment depending on the severity.
 - A. This shall extend to sharing information unlawfully within the State of Greater Gaul as per the Classified Information Act 2033.
- II. Any investigation into an espionage case shall be conducted by the Ministry of Home Affairs in coordination with State organisations and agencies.
- III. Assisting a foreign power in committing or attempting to commit espionage shall be a crime as per Sub-section I of this Article.
- IV. Agents shall be listed as known terrorists, dormant if imprisoned or not in the country.
