The University of Minnesota Twin Cities signed and submitted the Funding Certification Agreement with the U.S Department of Education on May 15, 2020 for HEERF I, was notified on 2/1/2021 and 5/24/2021 that it would be awarded continued funding under HEERF II and HEERF III. The University agrees to use these funds in the manner specified in the Funding Certification and Agreement, specifically allocating at least 50% of the funds to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.
The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. Block grants were awarded to graduate/professional students who had EFCs within the established Pell range. Degree completion grants were awarded to 4th year students (New High School admits) and 3rd year (transfer students) who are 1-9 credits short of the 120 credits required to graduate in Spring 2022, who demonstrated financial need. Emergency grants were available to degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate students.
Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the funds by type:	Students were informed that they could use the funds to cover any expenses. They were informed they could use it to pay any outstanding balance at the institution if they chose to do so.
