

COVID-19 Safety Protocols

Topic	Protocol
Social Distancing	• Students/Staff should be seated at least 3 feet apart as space allows
Masks	• Masks are optional for all individuals inside district schools and buildings
Hand Washing/Hand Sanitizing	• Students and staff will wash or sanitize their hands upon entering the building • Hand sanitizer will be placed around the building for use throughout the day as needed
Cleaning	• Daily cleaning routine for classrooms at the end of the school day • Bathrooms cleaned 2-3 times per day • Increased cleaning of high touch areas such as water fountains, door handles, etc.
Visitors	• Visitors will be permitted into the school in all areas except the cafeteria • When interacting with students, visitors will remain at least 3 feet away
Cafeteria/Lunch	• All students will eat in the cafeteria/nearby areas • Students should be spaced 3 feet apart as space allows • Due to space limitations, visitors will not be able to eat in the cafeteria with students
Lockers	• Lockers will be available for student use.
Specials Classes Elem.	• Students will wash or sanitize their hands when entering the special's classroom.
Field Trips	• Field Trips will be permitted • Staff should assign seats on the bus and note seating chart
Water Fountains	• Bottle filler water fountains only
Bus	• Students will use hand sanitizer upon entering the bus
Positive Cases and Response	• EPS will consult with local public health officials
Parent Home Screening	• Parents will screen their children at home for fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea. • Consult a medical professional if symptomatic as necessary. • Students do not report to school if symptomatic.

Dr. Lindsay Huse Statement on Masks

As the Douglas County community continues to respond to the continuing spread of the COVID-19 Delta variant, there are a few points the Douglas County Health Department (DCHD) would like to make.

- We will follow the science and the best recommendations of established, credible professionals in public health and medicine. As we learn more about how this virus behaves in people and in our environment, those recommendations can change. Based on transmission in Douglas County at this time, we recommend that **all** people wear masks in public, get vaccinated, practice good handwashing, stay home when sick, and get tested.
- Our goal is to keep people healthy and alive- preferably while keeping our community functioning as fully as possible.
- DCHD is working hand-in-hand with school districts to determine how best to implement recommendations in their districts, based on their own deep knowledge of the people they serve. This may include masking policies. Or, this may include the use of masks when transmission within schools is identified if a masking policy is not already in place. Schools are also planning other layers of interventions. We will continue working together closely to protect students and staff alike, and when cases arise, we will handle them on a case-by-case basis.
- We have tools at our disposal that can help us shorten the severity of the current spike in cases, and ensure our hospital capacity, education systems, and economy are protected. We need your help, though! Vaccinations remain the best tool we have, and they put our community in a better place to fight this than where we were a year ago. Wear your masks- the more people who wear them, the less virus is able to get into the air. Keep physical distances as much as possible, and as always, wash your hands and stay home when sick.
- Together, we can be the community that fights back. We can do this, Douglas County.

This is not politics and this is not entertainment – this is health and science.

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
