Type as Image

Round 1

Using your poster headline, create a composition that expresses something of the quality of your event.

Isolate one aspect of your event to riff off of, for example with the title "Self Love Baby", riff off the aesthetic of Valentine's Day. For the title "Hit The Streets", play off the aesthetic of street signs.

Round 2

Then create another composition that expresses the opposite. For example, make "Self Love Baby" appear rough and angry. Make "Hit The Streets" appear soft and sweet.

As usual try out a bunch of ideas, and whittle it down to one for each round.

Doing this exercise, you might find that your poster title is feeling too long ... if so, consider shortening your title, making it a bit more catchy and succinct. For example "14 annual Hit The Streets Fundraiser" might become: "Hit The Streets" and we learn it's a 14th annual fundraiser in the 1-sentence description.




