4. A few key points:

- a. Lyon & Healy, Salvi, Venus, and Camac are all good brands. Lyon & Healy and Salvi are the most common and well-known in the USA. Choosing a well-known and trusted brand will make selling the harp much easier if that is necessary in the future.
 - i. If something seems too good to be true, it almost certainly is (where harps are concerned). There are harps available for just a few hundred dollars online, but they are more like a toy than an actual instrument and will not work to practice on.
- b. Both new and pre-owned harps are completely fine, as long as the used harp has been kept in good condition. Even a fairly old harp may still have a great sound and play well!
- c. Middle School: look for a Lyon & Healy Troubadour VI lever harp or something of a similar size. Other good options are:
 - i. Lyon & Healy Ogden,
 - ii. Lyon & Healy Prelude
 - iii. Salvi Gaia
 - iv. Dusty Strings Ravenna.
- d. High School: look for a pedal harp with at least 40 strings, ideally more (47 is full-sized). School instruments are Lyon & Healy #85 or Chicago Style petites, grand petites, and concert grand pedal harps.

- f. When considering a used harp, the most important questions are:
 - i. Does it seem to be in good condition? Has it been well-taken care of?
 - ii. Do I like the sound? Does it feel like it fits me?
 - iii. Does the price seem appropriate? A good way to check is to search for comparable harps on different listings (like Dallas Harp Society Classifieds or Harp Column Classifieds) and see if the prices are similar.
