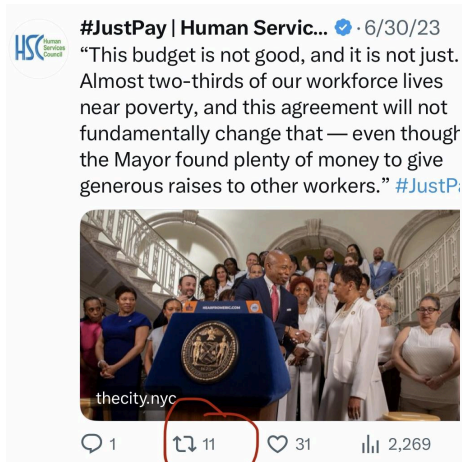

Post a tweet:

Phone: Go to your feed and click the blue plus sign on the bottom right.

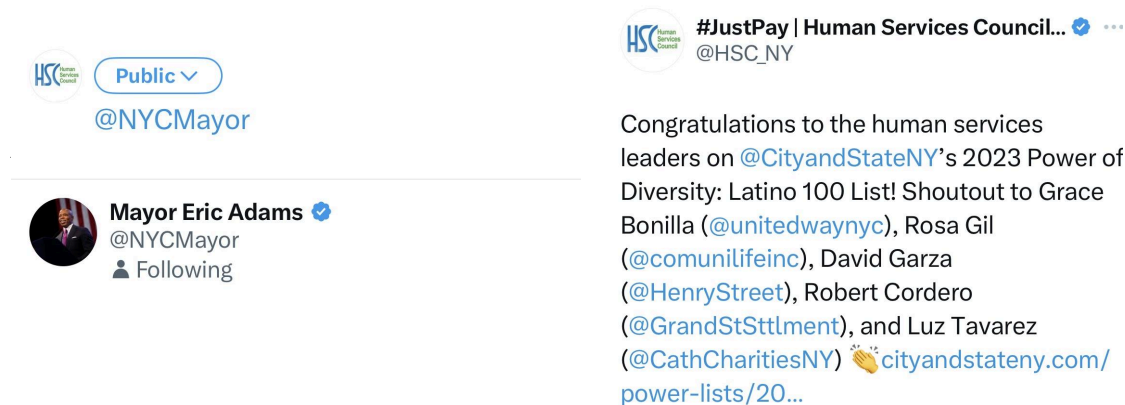
Computer: Go to your feed and start typing in the “what is happening” box.

Character Count: 280 characters.

Important: Mention the handles of elected officials and organizations when relevant! They get notifications when they are mentioned in tweets, and this will help your tweet gain popularity.

How to mention a handle:

Type the “@” symbol followed by the name of the person/organization. Their handle should automatically generate. Select their handle when you see it.



Find Your Legislator's Twitter Handles:

Find all of your elected officials and their Twitter handles [here](#).

Once the page generates your elected officials, click the Twitter bird icon next to their name to find their Twitter handle.

Add a photo(s):

You can add up to four photos in one tweet. Tag **up to 10** elected officials, organizations or other activists in photos when relevant! They will get a notification and your tweet will gain more popularity.



How to tag:

1) Select "Tag People":

How many programs will have to close next year because @NYCMayor won't pay human services workers livable wages? The City's poverty wages have caused staff turnover and program closures. We need #JustPay NOW to stay open next year! #DayWithoutHumanServices

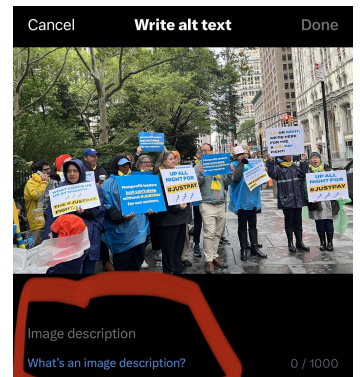

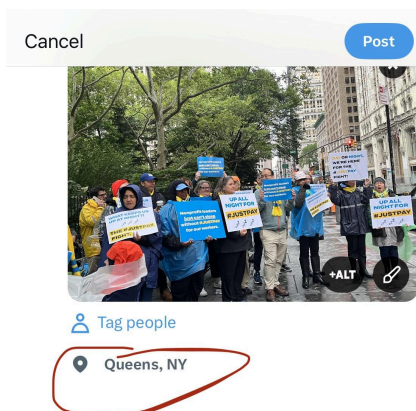

Post a video

Video is a great way to tell your story! Be sure to accompany with text giving context and mentioning the handles of your legislators.

Please note: X doesn't allow you to tag people in videos.

X (Twitter) Video Maximum Length: 140 seconds

X Threads

If you're having trouble telling your story within X's 140 second video length, posting an X Thread is a great way to tell your story in a longer form.

How to create an X Thread:

- 1) Post your first tweet introducing your story. Try to make it a hook that draws people in.
- 2) Click the reply button (it looks like a speech bubble), and post your second tweet.
- 3) After you post your second tweet, click the reply button ***FOR THAT TWEET (do not reply to your original tweet)***. Post your third tweet, and so on.
- 4) Your story will appear as one "thread." Example here:

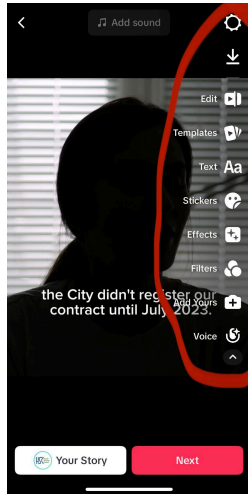
How to Post a TikTok:

- 1) Click the plus (+) sign at the bottom of your feed.
- 2) You can either record directly on TikTok or upload a pre-recorded video from your phone.
- 3) **Read a full guide on using TikTok [here](#).**
- 4) **Important:** When you're done, or if you want to take a pause, be sure to save your TikTok as a draft! It will save directly to the drafts section of your TikTok account. You can save your TikTok as a draft in two ways:
 - a) Hit "Next" then "Drafts" on the bottom left or
 - b) Hit the back arrow on the top left and click "Save Draft".



Adding Effects to Your TikTok

After you upload your video, use the sidebar on the right. Click the down arrow at the bottom of the menu items to see the full list of features:



Down arrow = saves TikTok to your phone's camera roll

Edit [MOST USEFUL FEATURE] = trim your video, add new clips, add sounds and music, adjust text placements, add effects, split clips in two, delete clips, crop, adjust volume

Templates = use existing TikTok templates

Text = add text with different font styles and backgrounds

Stickers = add stickers, gifs, emojis locations, mentions, polls

Effects = add effects to change visual appearance, transitions

Filters = add overlays to make your TikTok have a different shade or hue

Add Yours = add a prompt for your followers to answer

Voice = record yourself speaking or add voice filters to change your voice

CapCut

CapCut is a free phone video editing app that allows you to create more advanced videos before posting to TikTok.

If you see a trending template that someone else used when you're scrolling through TikTok, and want to use it for your own TikToks, you will often see a button at the bottom of the TikTok saying "CapCut - Use This Template." Click on that and it will automatically take you to CapCut.

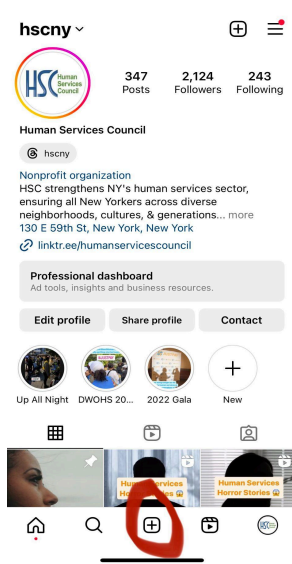

**You will need to create one on your phone, since you can't post to IG from your desktop. If you have Facebook, you can automatically use the same login information.*

Sharing Your Content:



Click the plus sign at the bottom to add content. Once you click it, you will see options at the bottom for “Post,” “Story,” “Reel,” and “Live.”

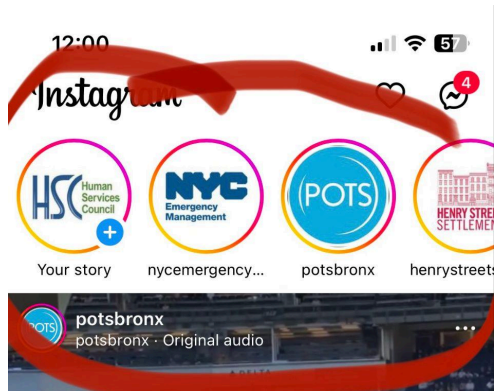
Post = for adding photos or videos to your feed

Story = adding content to your IG stories, which last 24 hours

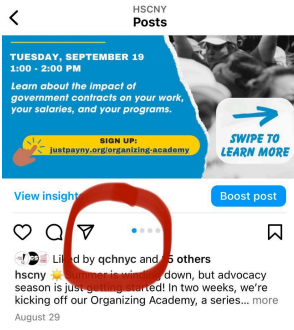
Reel = sharing a reel, which is a video less than 90 seconds that displays in the “Reels” section of IG

Live = livestreaming on IG

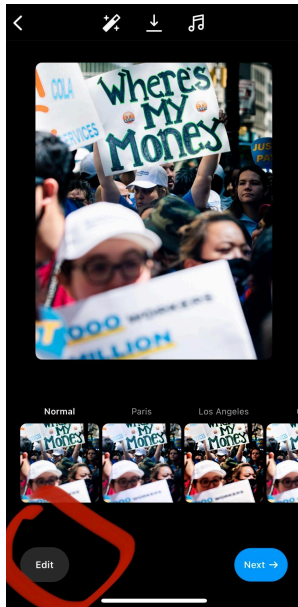
IG Stories



Press and hold down the circle above “Your Story” to add videos and photos to your story. It will stay up there for 24 hours.

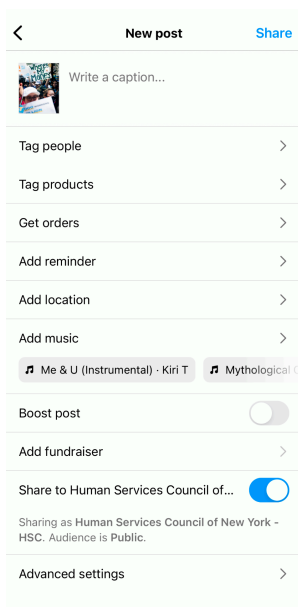


You can also add other people's posts to your story. To do that, click the arrow at the bottom of their post and click "add to story."



Click "edit" to make visual edits to your photo or video.

Before posting your photo or video, be sure to:



- 1) Add a caption mentioning any relevant elected officials or organizations.
- 2) Tag any elected officials and organizations.
- 3) Add your location if you're at an action.



Creating Videos

Videos are a great way to tell your story on IG! Videos can be any length, but if you want them show up on the “Reels” section, they should be shorter than 90 seconds.

You can either record the video on your phone camera and then upload it to IG, or record it directly on Instagram.

Creating Reels

Reels are videos that are 90 seconds or less. You can add music, effects etc. They appear on both your feed and the “Reels” section of Instagram. They are IG’s fastest growing feature and a great way to tell your story!

THREADS

Create an account: First, download the Threads app. You need an Instagram account to create a Threads account. If you do not have an Instagram account, download and install the Instagram app to create an account. Once you have an account, return to the Threads app. Create your Threads profile by importing details from your Instagram account.

Threads functions similarly to X (Twitter). So, like Twitter, the best way to tell your story will either be through video or a “thread” (as described in the Twitter section of this guide).

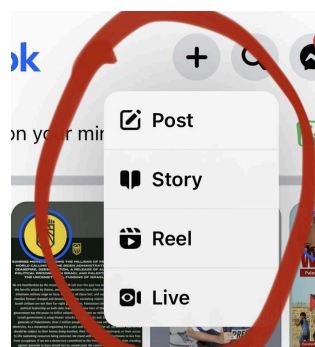

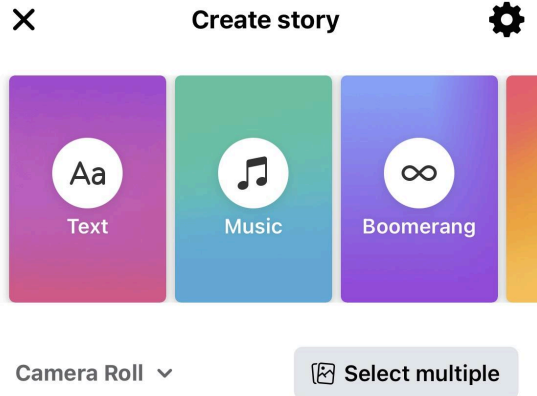

How to post:



Click the plus sign on the top right and select the kind of content you want to post.



To add content to your stories, click the “Create Story” option on the top left.
