

Sermon Notes: “Commitment in the Face of the Cross”

Text: Luke 22:39–71

Main Theme

True commitment to God is revealed in moments of pressure, temptation, and testing.

I. The Reality of Spiritual Attack (vv. 31–39 context)

- Satan desires to “**sift**” believers
 - Goal: destroy your **testimony** and **effectiveness**
- The enemy is not trying to inconvenience you
 - He wants to **ruin you**
- Only **God’s grace** restrains him

Application

- Do you want more than just “getting into heaven”?
- A shallow mindset:

“I’m saved—that’s enough”

- A biblical mindset:

“I want to live a life that honors Christ and earns eternal reward”

II. Jesus’ Example of Prayer & Dependence (vv. 39–41)

- Jesus goes to the **Mount of Olives (Gethsemane)**
 - A **customary place of prayer**
- If Jesus needed prayer...
 - 👉 How much more do we?

Key Command

“Pray that ye enter not into temptation”

Application

- Prayer is not optional—it is **spiritual survival**
 - Many fall not because they are weak...
→ but because they are **prayerless**

III. The Agony of Surrender (vv. 42–44)

Jesus’ Prayer:

“Not my will, but thine be done”

Key Truths:





- Jesus **counted the cost**
- He **felt the weight** of suffering
- He still **submitted fully**

Core Principle:




Commitment is proven when your will conflicts with God’s will

The Missing Ingredient: Commitment

Without commitment:

-  No availability
-  No soul-winning
-  No obedience
-  No spiritual growth

With commitment:

-  You are **usable**
 -  You are **faithful**
 -  You are **steady regardless of circumstances**

Application Questions

- Can God **count on you**?
 - Is your commitment:
 - Conditional?
 - Or lifelong?
-

IV. Intensity of the Spiritual Battle (v. 44)

- Jesus experienced:
 - **Agony**
 - **Extreme stress**
 - Sweat “like drops of blood”

Key Insight:

- Pressure didn’t stop Him...
👉 It drove Him to **pray more earnestly**
-

Application

- What do you do under pressure?
 - Quit?
 - Complain?
 - Or pray more?
-

V. The Disciples vs. Jesus (vv. 45–46)

Jesus	Disciples
Agony	Sorrow
Prayed more	Fell asleep

Lesson:

Sorrow without prayer leads to weakness
Pressure with prayer produces strength

VI. Betrayal and Hypocrisy (vv. 47–48)

- Judas betrays Jesus with a **kiss**

Powerful Truth:

You can be close to Jesus externally and still be far from Him internally

Application

- Religious appearance ≠ true relationship
 - Examine your heart:
 - Are you following Christ...
 - Or just around Him?
-

VII. Fighting the Wrong Way (vv. 49–51)

- Peter uses a **sword**
- Jesus rebukes him

Key Principle:

Spiritual battles cannot be won with physical methods

- The Kingdom of God is not advanced by:
 - Force
 - Fear
 - But by:
 - Truth
 - Love
 - The Gospel
-

VIII. The Power of Darkness (v. 53)

“This is your hour, and the power of darkness”

Important Clarification:

- Darkness is not winning
- God is **allowing it temporarily**

Truth:

God is always in control—even when evil seems active

IX. Peter's Denial (vv. 54–62)

- Peter:
 - Followed “afar off”
 - Blended in
 - Denied Christ 3 times

Root Cause:

- **Fear of consequences**
-

Application

- Do we deny Christ by:
 - Silence?
 - Compromise?
 - Blending in?
-

Turning Point:

Peter “wept bitterly”

- True repentance involves:
 - Conviction
 - Brokenness
 - Sorrow over sin
-

X. The Mocking of Christ (vv. 63–65)

- Jesus is:
 - Mocked
 - Beaten

- Blindfolded

Why did He endure it?

Because He loves us

- Sin is not small
- It required:
 - Suffering
 - Sacrifice
 - The cross

XI. The Rejection of Truth (vv. 66–71)

- Religious leaders ask:
 - “Are you the Christ?”
- Jesus answers truthfully
- They reject Him anyway

Key Truth:

People don't reject Christ because of lack of evidence
They reject Him because of their heart

XII. Final Application: Our Response

1. Commitment

- Will you fully surrender to God's will?

2. Prayer

- Will you depend on God daily?

3. Boldness

- Will you stand for Christ openly?

4. Gospel Urgency

- The world is lost
 - We **must share the Gospel**
-

Practical Church Application (from sermon emphasis)

- Easter is an opportunity:
 - People are more open
- Don't let materials sit unused
- Give:
 - Time
 - Effort
 - Participation

“Jesus gave everything—can we give an hour?”
