Topic #1 - Outdoor Learning Environments in Early Childhood: Meaningful outdoor experiences and learning in early childhood is one way to bridge the opportunity gap in children's outcomes related to educational success, physical and mental health, and well-being. With new emphasis on early learning, and federal investments becoming available, we have an opportunity to make outdoor learning an essential part of high-quality early childhood education for all young children. Join this table discussion to learn about specific funding needs for strengthening three core strategies (practice, policy advocacy, and research) for outdoor learning in early childhood.

Topic #2 - Nature + Nurture (N^2): Prioritizing Youth of Color Through Culturally Relevant and Meaningful Outdoor Experiences: Meaningful connection to the outdoors means more than classroom activities taught outside. It captured the feeling of many parents whose children would benefit from the physical and mental release that only getting outside can provide. The campaign partnered with the Children's Hospital Colorado, statewide libraries, Boys and Girls Clubs, park and recreation centers, state parks, and many others to spread the messaging. Access to Nature: A Strategy for Health Equity

As we emerge from this crisis, it is imperative we rethink philanthropic investments and redefine the narrative to approach urgent systemic infrastructure needs ensuring the health and well-being of diverse communities.
