- 8. Did your subject avoid any questions? If so, why or why do you think so?
- 9. What were the reactions of your subject once you told them the purpose of this interview? Did it matter to your subject?
- 10. How accurate do you believe your subject's memories were? How do you know? Does it matter?
- 11. Describe how you felt while conducting the interview?
- 12. Describe how your subject felt about being interviewed?
- 13. What were some unexpected results of your interview?
- 14. Were there any significant reactions or changes in body language to certain questions?
- 15. What are your thoughts on how the interview went? To what extent do you value the data you got from the interview?
