

CHAMPION HIGH SCHOOL NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

SELECTION CRITERIA POINT SYSTEM

A student must have 34 or more points to be considered for acceptance into the National Honor Society. You may obtain points from activities in which you were previously or are currently involved. Previous activities may only date back to 9th grade.

1. Scholarship – A minimum of 10 points are required in this category

- 10 points - 92-95 GPA
- 11 points - 96-99 GPA
- 12 points - 100+ GPA

2. Character – 10 points are given for 1 positive teacher recommendation.

Points will be deducted according to

- 2 points per discipline referral
- 6 points per day of ISS
- 10 points per day of suspension
- 10 points per assignment to AC

3. Leadership - A minimum of 2 points are required in this category

- a. Essay documenting leadership - 2 pts.
- b. Elected/appointed officer position - 2 pts.

4. Service - A minimum of 10 points are required in this category

Service is categorized as inside or outside community service.

a. School-sponsored activities are completed at or for BISD. The following are examples of how a student can earn inside service points.

1 pt/8 hours of ***school*** volunteer work. Any combination of hours from various volunteer activities at school during your high school years may count. Activities completed as a requirement to maintain membership in another organization do not count.

- 1 pt/yr – ROTC
- 1 pt/yr – Sport
- 1 pt/yr – Band/Color guard, Choir, or Orchestra
- 1 pt/yr – Yearbook or Newspaper Staff
- 1 pt/yr – UIL Academic Competition/Academic Decathlon
- 1 pt/yr – School Club (FCCLA, HOSA, Interact, BPA, etc.)
- 1 pt/yr – Honor Organization (Spanish National Honor Society)
- 1 pt/yr – Cheerleading
- 1 pt/yr – Drama Productions
- 1 pt/yr – Dance Team
- 1 pt/yr – PALS/STARS
- 1 pt yr – Debate Team Competition or Mock Trial
- 1 pt/yr – Foreign Language Competition
- 1 pt/yr – FFA
- 1 pt/yr – FCA

b. Community activities are any activities outside of school in which you have participated in for the betterment of the community. Examples are church groups, youth groups, clubs sponsored outside of school such as Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts, volunteer groups, or community art endeavors. Lessons or classes of any kind do not count as a community activity.

1 pt/8 hours of **community** volunteer work. Any combination of hours from various activities during your high school years may count. A maximum of 4 points will be awarded per activity.

1 pt/yr – Youth group (e.g. Young Life), only one youth group per year will count

1 pt/yr – Community band, orchestra or theater

1 pt/yr – Scouts

1 pt/yr – 4H

Example 1: You went on a mission trip with your church for a week in the summer and worked approximately 40 hours building houses for needy families. You will receive 4 points for this activity.

Example 2: You worked at a food pantry for 6 hours, and then participated in a trash pickup for 2 hours. You will receive 1 point for these 8 hours of service.

Example 3: As part of another organization you completed the required service hours to maintain membership for that organization. You receive no points for these hours, but you do receive 1 credit for membership in these organizations per year in section a or b

Example 4: You volunteer 20 hours to help a family member move. You receive no points for these hours.

Example 5: You put in 50 hours training and participating in a club sport. You receive no points for these hours.
