\*\*Note: As a general rule of thumb, most of these opportunities have a **4 hour cap** per month.

Please try to participate in service projects and community activities within Key Club for the majority of your hours.

Also, for most of these, make sure you keep a <u>stopwatch</u> on to provide verification for your hours and take a photo of what you've done afterwards. Always remember to submit to the PSH form each month!

#### 1. Card/Letter Writing:

- Create handmade or digitally designed letters to send to organizations that support communities such as frontline workers or the elderly. This can be done for organizations such as <u>Paper Bridges</u>, <u>Letters for Lifesavers</u>, <u>Letters of Love</u>, <u>Love for</u> <u>the Elderly</u>, <u>Service Salute</u>, and more!
  - Note: You must also provide proof that such cards/letters were actually sent to the organization. This can be in the form of a screenshot of you submitting them in email or of you mailing them.
  - Resources: A device such as a smartphone or computer, paper, art supplies, mailing supplies

# 2. Color-A-Smile:

 This involves coloring in printable templates online and shipping them to troops overseas, elderly in nursing homes, and anyone in need of a smile! Templates can be found on their website, <u>Color A Smile</u>: D

Resources: A working printer (or you can trace the drawings), coloring supplies, envelopes, and stamps

## 3. Chalk Walk:

Make a chalk walk in your neighborhood that will bring joy to people walking. This can mean complex or short and sweet drawings and messages written in chalk on sidewalks. Perfect for some fun in the sun!

## 4. **Bedtime Stories:**

 Record a video or audio recording of yourself reading your favorite children's book and provide it to a local children's hospital as a resource to help the patients through hard times.

## 5. Online Tutoring:

 Everyone needs some help sometimes! You can become a tutor for an already existing organization or create your own organization if you're full of ambition!

Resources: Sufficient knowledge in a particular subject you'd like to tutor
and any other documents that may be required of you to register.
 Reliable internet and device. Background check may be required.

#### 6. Hospital Volunteering:

- Passionate about medicine? Love to help others? Look no further than hospital volunteering at your local Sutter/DMC/etc! Work with like-minded peers on discharging patients and stocking rooms.
  - Note: Typically requires a tuberculosis test and commitment to a shift for a minimum of a year

# 7. <u>Translators Without Borders:</u>

- Help to translate medical texts for healthcare professionals with this nonprofit organization. Apply to become a volunteer through <u>Translators Without Borders</u>
   You must be at least 18 to apply!
  - Note: In order to be a translator, you must be fluent in at least one other language besides your native language. However, you can also apply as a volunteer to help fundraise for their organization, or as a project manager, graphic and web designer!
  - **Resources:** Smartphone

#### 8. Infographic Making:

- Create infographics or other educational materials about Key Club's preferred charities or a cause that you think needs to be addressed in today's world. I.e.
   YES! Initiative, Children's Miracle Network, Thirst Project, etc.
  - Note: You can use digital software such as Canva, Google Slides, or any other program to make these! Please screenshot where you end up posting them (i.e. Instagram story) as proof of completion and publication!!
  - **Resources:** A device such as a computer or smartphone
