If you receive a \$3000 scholarship, does that just mean that there is \$3000 less of a loan for the Teacher Pledge to forgive after your 3-4 years of employment?	AL NM	That is correct! Depending on your FASFA, you may be eligible for the \$20,000 from the TEACHER Pledge in addition to the scholarship aid. However, if the FASFA does not indicate “need” the outlined statement is true.
Will student teaching placements still happen if everything is virtual? Or will that depend on the school?		All signs point to yes. We have been able to work with our partner districts this year to maintain our school-based field placements in the virtual realm. We will continue to communicate with our partner districts in regard to their modality of instruction (virtual, hybrid, or online) and work to maintain field placements for teacher candidates.
