- 9.4 million for water quality
 - o 2.9 federal
 - 1.1 from farmers
 - 1.8 Ct river valley (4 times from the year before)
 - o 44,000 acres of conservation practices
 - 22 production areas inspected
 - o 678 technical and regulatory visits
 - o 129 with districts and federal in Ct river valley
 - Vt pay for performance program is open. **Due January 20th**
 - Performance based payments
 - o Farm agronomic practice program

- Payment for ecosystem services (pilot program to pay farmers who go above and beyond)
- The Ag committee is larger and very new.
 - Still figuring out what their goals are.
- The future will hold more money for working lands
- Follow the DBIC (lots of grant possibilities)

- Nitrogen and Soil Health
- Available for visits (agronomy)
- From westchester NY, went to Cornell
- Peace Corps then wisconsin Discovery Farms
- Nitrogen efficiency work
 - What does that mean for water quality, environment, economics and agronomics
 - Nitrogen cycle is complex
 - Many paths for N loss
 - Only 90% is taken up by the plant
 - Loss through air and mostly through leaching
 - Tile drained fields are worse
 - Nitrogen use efficiency assessments
 - How is it being currently used and what practices can improve it
 - The Wisconsin N use efficiency project was a project that measured N on 90 farms
 - Measuring Nitrogen use efficiency is found from Partial Factor Productivity= Yield(lb/ac) over N applied (lb/ac)
 - Provided tools for farmers making nitrogen decisions
 - Zero- N test strips, assess N credits from manure and legumes
 - NRCS practice for Comparing fields.
 - How can this apply to hay? Work done was for monitoring corn silage and groundwater
 - How do you know the measurement when there is no tile?
 - Need to put equipment in ground
