Dear Assemblymember Rebecca Bauer-Kahan,:

## We, the following undersigned organizations, are writing in strong support for AB 2054.

AB 2054 is an important step towards curbing the excessive and pernicious influence that PG&E, SoCal Edison, and SDG&E have over the decisions of California's government. Their undue influence has led to lax oversight, deadly wildfires, ever-rising electricity bills that are crushing the budgets of everyday people across California. Perversely, their influence is also why California ratepayers have fewer options than ever before to control their electricity bills through rooftop solar, and may have yet fewer options to control their bills through energy conservation if the Utility Tax is not reined in.

AB 2054 sensibly closes the outrageous revolving door that allows the utilities to employ former CPUC commissioners to use their significant insider knowledge and access to influence the decisions of their former colleagues. AB 2054 would prohibit a commissioner from being employed by an entity regulated by the CPUC for ten years after the expiration of their term of service.

It is bad enough that the utility industry made an astonishing \$111 million in campaign contributions to candidates at every level of government between 2017 and 2023 alone. That's on top of \$11 million of lobbying expenditures between 2020 and 2022 alone, as well as millions of additional dollars thrown around to influence the activities of NGOs and academics.

It is mind-boggling that on top of their breathtaking financial influence, it is possible for a CPUC commissioner to be making critical decisions supposedly on behalf of the public interest one day, and literally lobbying their former colleagues on behalf of the utilities the day after. Yet, one of PG&E's senior lobbyists fits this description exactly.

Every day this revolving door is allowed to exist is a slap in the face to the public. It must be ended. And this bill must be the beginning of a larger effort to restore balance, to check the influence of the utilities, and put the public interest in the drivers' seat.

For these reasons, we are in strong support of AB 2054 and urge your aye vote.
