ABSTRACT

An abstract must accompany each manuscript; This abstract must be entirely consistent on its own (e.g., without numbers, tables, equations, or reference citations) and written as a paragraph. The abstract should research objectives (Purpose), methodology (Methods), findings (Results), and engagement relationship (Implications). The abstract section should be typed in Times New Roman with a font size of 10 pt and with some words 150-250. The abstract should only be ordered in one paragraph and one-column format.

Keyword: provide 3-6 (keyboard 1, keyboard 2, keyboard 3).

INTRODUCTION

This template must be used as a guide for the format and layout of writing articles to be published in the IJARI. Authors must follow all the writing rules regarding typeface, size, design, number of words, systematics, and writing references. The author must also ensure that the article uses excellent and correct Indonesian. The paper's contents must include abstracts and contacts in the font: Times New Roman size: 11, and line spacing: Single (1,15). In addition, authors are required to use this template file (NOT create a new file) to avoid mismatches in the layout of the entire page (paper size, margins, etc.).

In the last paragraph, an author must clearly state the work's objectives. The author must provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results (Mayer 1975a, 1975b, 1980). References must be cited in, e.g. (Anderson et al. 1990, Salehizadeh et al. 2004), in which the reference manager is recommended.

METHOD

The methodology can consist of material, research methods, references, instruments and data analysis, and modelling. Completely write down the research location, the number of respondents, how to process the results of observations or interviews or questionnaires, and how to measure performance benchmarks; The general method does not need to be written in detail, but it is enough to refer to the reference book.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

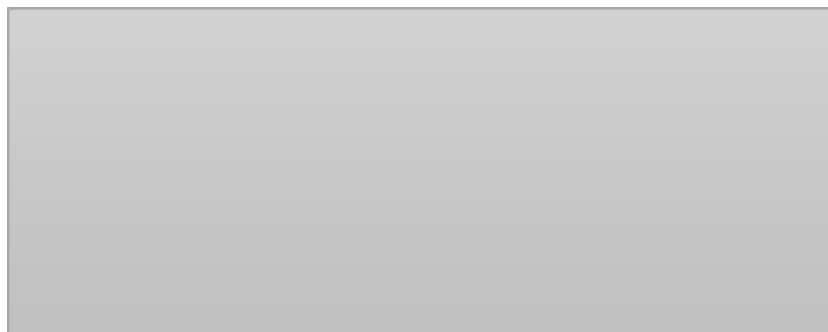


Figure 1. Example of Figure
