We also had our second IST Committee meeting of the year. We had the opportunity to see demos from Nile and also talked quite a bit about the Nebraska Cybersecurity Network. Andy Boell was in to discuss next steps and options for the second round of grants. This leads nicely into the survey that was sent out. Two years ago we identified several areas districts wanted to work on in terms of cyber security. We are asking each district to fill out a survey to let us know where they stand. We already have several in and last week Senator Sanders was in and I shared the preliminary results with her. We also had our Pen Test completed this month. We have received the initial findings and hope to have everything back in the next few weeks. My plan will be to give the IST Committe a

synopsis at the February meeting. During January we will be working on our two big projects for the year. We had hoped to space them out but because of delivery delays everything seems to be arriving now. We have already begun working on our Network Access Control project and hope to start the move to our new Nimble SAN as soon as that is complete.
