COURSE CATALOG DESCRIPTION

FSHD 2344 Fashion Collection Production (3-2-3)

A continuation of the Fashion Collection Design course. Emphasis on the production, costing and marketing of a cohesive collection of fashion apparel. Instruction in completing production patterns for all collection garments. Skills (G) Course Type (W)

You will be finalizing the creation of your collection of 5 complete garments/looks and this course will help you in that process. You will be expected to produce your remaining garments in the Fashion Design Lab exclusively. All sewing and pattern work must be done in the lab.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE FASHION DESIGN DEPARTMENT

FSHD 2343 - Fashion Collection Design is only offered in the Fall and is designed as part one of a two part year long commitment of the capstone course for the Fashion Design Program.

FSHD 2344 - Fashion Collection Production, is part two of this capstone and will only be offered in the Spring.

Your commitment to these courses is extremely important. The class will rely on everyone to make the Spring Fashion Showcase a success.

Please think carefully about this time frame of a year long commitment to ensure that your work will be to the best level it can be and that you will be able to fulfill your responsibilities that your fellow students will rely on from you.

STUDENT SUCCESS

Plan to spend at least twice as many hours per week outside of class as you do during scheduled class time. Additional time will be required for research, written assignments and projects not completed in class. The Fashion Lab will be open for your use on Tuesday and Thursdays from 12-3 and Fridays from 10-2. Additional time can be coordinated.

There is no short cut for success in this course. It will require extra work and effort on your part to be successful.

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODOLOGY

This course is designed as a lecture/lab combined course. Students will work on projects during class time with instructor guidance. Successful completion of this course requires maturity and self discipline with keen attention to details. All students are required to have the appropriate tools needed for every class session, as the pace of the course does not allow for shared equipment or tools. Students should arrive on time with required supplies, set up and ready to start and attend every class. If you do not bring your supplies to class, it will affect your grade. Open Lab times will be available for students during posted times. You are encouraged to ask questions and actively engage in class discussions. We are here to help you develop the skills you will need to be successful in the Fashion Design industry and more specifically develop good habits as a pattern maker and designer. Please know that you can always come to us with questions, comments or concerns you have related to the course work.

COURSE RATIONALE

The Fashion Design program prepares students for careers in fashion related fields. Creative studies in design fundamentals, fashion analysis, fashion history, textiles, color, and sketching, along with technical training in draping, pattern making, pattern grading, and clothing construction provide the training required for entry-level employment. The Fashion Collection Design course focuses on the skills necessary to create, design and make a complete collection of 5-7 garments

with emphasis on developing a business plan to market the collection to prospective buyers.

COMMON COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES/OUTCOMES

CAPSTONE COURSE - Produce all garments designed for a collection. Calculate wholesale and retail cost for each garment in the collection. Create production patterns for each garment in the collection. Write a plan for marketing the collection.

In addition to the above listed objectives, students will also construct all 5 looks, for a fashion show and receive guidance from your professors that will critique according to industry standards. Students will also plan, create and execute a Spring fashion showcase.

All pattern work, sewing and construction must be done in the Fashion Lab using the industrial sewing machines, including the single needle and the overlocks.
