Good afternoon CT Farm to School Community,

We are sending this to ensure everyone has updated information about the federal impacts to farm to school at this moment, and an understanding of how the Collaborative and partners are moving forward.

- Local Food For Schools and Child Care Program (LFSCC) and Local Food Purchasing Agreement (LFPA) planned for later this year were terminated by the federal government earlier this month.
 - What does this mean? At this point, no new federal funds will be provided for these programs. These funds were never in our state's hands to begin with, but \$5.65 million was promised for the future. LFS funding from the first round, launched in December 2021, remains available - and there is a tight deadline to spend it (April 30th).

- The FY25 USDA Patrick Leahy Farm to School Grant Program was cancelled just this
 week (March 24th). Applicants received word via email from USDA that their application
 was no longer being submitted and questions could not be answered.
 - What does this mean? Despite being congressionally authorized, there will be no federal farm to school grant resources for the fiscal year. We know of <u>at least four</u> multi-partner projects that will not have the chance to move forward as a result of this cancellation.

So what can we do?

- 1. Tell your story & share the impact! Reach out to CT's U.S. Senators and Members of Congress to share your disappointment and the story of how the cancellation of these funds will impact your farm, school, operation, and/or youth.
- 2. Advocate for state support of farm to school- Reach out to your state legislators and make sure they know about these federal cuts to farm to school. Ask for support of HB 7013 to ensure there is continued state funding for farm to school grants and funds for local foods in school meal programs. Preserving CT Grown for CT Kids and CT Local Food for Schools Program is paramount at this moment!

- **3.** If you are a School Food Authority- please use the tools, resources, and support to capture LFS funds from the first round of funds before they expire on April 30th. Connect with your Farm to School Regional Coordinator for support!
