Nouns

-Common and Proper Nouns

- Common Noun names any person, place, thing, or idea
 Examples: girl, boy, school, team, happiness
 (begins with a lowercase letter)
- 2. <u>Proper Noun</u> names a particular person, place, thing, or idea **Examples:** Mary, Joe, St. Catherine Laboure, St. Louis Cardinals (begins with an uppercase letter)

-Singular and Plural Nouns

- 1. <u>Singular Noun</u> names one person, place, thing, or idea *Examples*: girl, tree, boy, desk, happiness
- 2. <u>Plural Noun</u> names more than one person, place, thing, or idea **Examples:** girls, trees, boys, desks, dreams
- To form most plural nouns, add s at the end.
- Nouns that end in ch, sh, x, s, or ss--add es to form the plural.
 Examples: churches, foxes, dresses
- If a noun ends in a consonant and y, the y becomes i and add es to form the plural.

Examples: baby--babies, story--stories, bunny--bunnies

• Some plural nouns are irregular which means you change their spelling to form the plural.

Examples: child--children, man--men, mouse--mice

-Possessive Nouns

1. Singular Possessive Nouns

- one person or thing shows ownership or possession
- a singular noun shows ownership by adding an apostrophe and s ('s)

Examples: hen's eggs, John's car, band's music

2. Plural Possessive Nouns

- more than one person or thing shows ownership or possession
- write the plural form of the noun then add the possession (s')

Examples: boys' team, girls' backpacks, foxes' dens

3. Irregular Plural Possessive Nouns

- irregular plurals do not end in s
- irregular plurals show ownership by adding an apostrophe and s ('s)

Examples: children's toys, mice's cheese

-Collective Nouns

Collective Noun - names a group of things, people, or ideas

Examples: swarm, class, family, crew, flock

-Nouns as Subjects

A noun is often used as the subject of a sentence. The subject tells who or what the sentence is about.

Examples: The <u>eggs</u> are in the basket.

Many fans attended the concert.

-Words used as Nouns and as Verbs

Many words can be used both as nouns and as verbs. Check closely to see how a word is used in a sentence.

Examples: He put a <u>stick</u> in the fire. (noun)

The glue will stick to the paper. (verb)
