Welcome Westport Warhawks!

In this class you can expect to work hard at improving your reading and writing along with your speaking, and listening skills while utilizing critical thinking. Your success will depend on how much effort you put into this class. Don't be afraid to ask questions and challenge yourself!

In 6th Grade, 7th. Grade, 8th. English Language Arts (Reading & Writing) we will focus on the Kentucky State Common Core Standards. We will work on mastering the two main areas of reading and writing through the use of Narrative, Informational and Argumentative resources. These three areas have been touched on in previous grades, but will be explored in more depth this year. We will start with narrative texts, then informational, and finally end the year with Argument. This year, you will start online where we will build community. You will also participate in a workshop style classroom that depends on participation in order to succeed! We will complete projects based on racial equity for publishing as well as backpack items.

Standards

Students will learn each of the standards by name and work toward mastering each one.

- Reading and Writing Informational Texts
- Reading and Writing Narrative Texts
- Reading and Writing Argumentative Texts
- Language Usage and Vocabulary

Independent Reading

Independent reading is crucial in order to become a more critical reader. Each class period, students will participate in Sustained Silent Reading (SSR) time. While reading, students will use reading strategies we've learned in class as well as answer critical thinking questions that pertain to their book. Books will be rented from the school library once each month as well as be provided in the classroom library. However, students are encouraged to bring books from home that interest them!

Guidelines for Success in Rooms 220 & 217

- 1. Students must be willing to try new things, to ask questions, and to sometimes fail. All of these are critical for learning and are expected and accepted in the classroom.
- 2. Students must have a positive attitude and be willing to participate in class. Participation is a major component of a student's grade.
- 3. Students will follow all class rules. In order for students to learn, the classroom must be a place of respect and order. Following the class rules is essential for success. At Westport SOAR expectations will be the standard.
- 4. Students will listen the first time a direction is given. The less time spent repeating directions, the more time the class can spend learning.
- 5. We are all in this together! We need our students, parents, and teachers all on the same page working towards the common goal of success and mastery for EVERY LEARNER.

What Students Need in Class Everyday

- 1. Folder and Writer's Notebook
- 2. Pencil or Writing Utensil
- 3. Folder (to take work home)
- 4. Independent Reading Book

- 1. We will show respect for ourselves and others at all times.
