

## Year 8 Music | Blues and Rock 'n' Roll

## Key Question: Why is "The Blues" considered to be the most important art form of the 20th century?

**Topic Overview:** Students will learn how the 20th century art form "the blues" gave birth to Rock N Roll. Students will learn how the simple repetitive chord structure of the blues was to influence and still influence popular music of the past and today.
