Abilities:

Reality Manipulation: Can twist and defy reality at will, achieving the logically impossible.

REALITY THREAT: Forces the timeline of reality and any multiverse to bend entirely to his will.

Unmimickable Powers: His abilities cannot be copied or replicated.

Universal Immunity: Immune to all powers, including those that might mirror his own.

BRUTE FORCE VICTORY: Any draw becomes a win (NEG DIFF), any loss becomes a win (MODERATE DIFF).

NEG DIFF: Inherently forces his victory in any conflict.

Mimicry: Can mimic the abilities and nature of any entity, including non-existent ones.

Existence Independence: Not bound by existence or the lack thereof; can operate outside any framework.

Conceptual Superiority: Literal absence is the ultimate victor against any character.

Furthermore, any element, no matter how small, that relates to Ethan Duster (including the absence of Ethan Duster) will inherently negate any opposing force. This extends to connections within an opponent's name; if a character's name contains the letter "E" or any other connection to "Ethan Duster," the larger conceptual piece related to Ethan Duster will always take precedence, resulting in a neg diff victory. This only works if it is in favor of what Ethan would've intended. For instance, if a villain named Ethan is going to attack his friend, he is not going to win.

INSTANT WIN: The ability to win literally against anyone, instantly. If anyone else also insta-wins, Ethan Duster's insta-win works by default.

WEAKNESS IMPRESS: Gives any person a weakness.

KILL INSTANTLY: Kills any entity that cannot be killed.

Narrative Override: The ability to rewrite the fundamental narrative in which any opponent exists, retroactively making their ultimate power or immunity a fallacy or a temporary state that Ethan has already overcome. This doesn't negate the power directly, but alters the reality where it holds true.

Conceptual Erasure (Targeted): Instead of general power negation, this ability allows Ethan to target and erase specific concepts from reality, including the concept of absolute immunity or inevitable victory as it applies to a specific opponent. This would unravel the very basis of their defining trait.

Acausality++: Ethan's existence and actions transcend cause and effect in relation to the opponent's abilities. His victory isn't a result of an action taken during the encounter, but a state that always was and always will be, independent of the opponent's inherent advantages.

Meta-Narrative Transcendence: Ethan becomes aware of and can manipulate the "story" of his conflict with the opponent. He can edit the meta-narrative so that the established outcome is his victory, treating their invincibility as a plot device he can alter.

The Ultimate Weakness Revelation (Beyond Inherent): The ability to perceive and exploit

weaknesses that are not inherent to the opponent's being or powers but are fundamental to the *source* of their power or their existence, even if that source is beyond conventional understanding or immunity. This bypasses direct immunity by targeting the underlying mechanism of their being.

Absolute Invalidation: A power that doesn't counter or negate, but simply invalidates the opponent's abilities as being inapplicable to Ethan's reality or existence. It's a conceptual "this doesn't count" applied to their defining traits.

NOTE: Ethan Duster brute forces every single power at once instantly. The main powers he always uses, is Mimicry, INSTANT WIN, NEG DIFF, POWER CONTRADICTION, and BRUTE FORCE VICTORY.

Weaknesses: None explicitly defined (The only potential contradiction would be self-imposed)

Bio: Ethan Glockenspiel Duster is a being whose fundamental nature transcends the limitations of conventional reality and power scaling. His existence operates on a conceptual level that guarantees his ultimate victory in any and all conflicts. His abilities defy logic and operate with absolute authority over all of existence and non-existence. The very concept of absence related to him holds ultimate power, and even subtle connections to his name guarantee his overwhelming victory. Ethan Duster is NOT omnipotent. He is omnivastant—a form of power that transcends omnipotence.

Beat an omnivastant being at 0% power without even existing in that timeline.

Detailed Analysis

Ethan Glockenspiel Duster is designed to be an unbeatable character operating beyond all conventional power scales. His powers are conceptual in nature, guaranteeing victory against any opponent, regardless of their power or abilities. The core of his power lies in reality manipulation, power negation, and the sheer force of his will dictating reality. In universes that rely on narrative or fate, his power to dictate reality and negate other powers makes him supreme. However, his existence might be seen as antithetical to the spirit of many stories, as he essentially removes all conflict and tension.

Potential Matchups

The Presence - While described with "untouchable" omnipotence, Ethan is specifically designed to contradict powers, therefore surpassing The Presence. Ethan could literally turn the presence into the absence.

The Writer - As an authorial entity, the Writer can alter the narrative of DC Comics itself, giving them similar reality-warping power. However, since Ethan has a power called, NEG DIFF, and the Writer can only choose what happens in DC COMICS only, Ethan likely wins the battle with neg diff. TOAA - Ethan Duster literally has a power called, BEAT TOAA, which beats TOAA, hence the name. Any opposition to Ethan can be easily contradicted and turned against his opponent, thus winning the fight. Again, negative difficulty. Seems like TOAA might be the one above all, but Ethan is the all above all.

Definite Matchups

Grug Crood - Able to kick logs mountains away and survive lightning, with omniversal threatening ideas that change the concept of the world. Despite immense power, not necessarily omnipotent. Sorry Grug, but Ethan takes the duster dub. It rhymes with Grug.

PPG (single entity) - Their immense power, such as traveling into the future in a casual race, extreme durability to a solar flare that could've affected earth, and extreme will power, definitely could beat characters such as the Qu, Saitama, and the Viltrum Empire. But when it comes to sugar spice and everything nice, they aint beating the earth, the dust, and the the man strong as such. Ethan will power-puff those girls away.

Curious George - Ah yes. The curious monkey who's curious adventures can kill multiverses, and also able to interact through reality itself through his mind (based on an actual episode), and sheer willpower to discover anything. Likely the ONLY entity who can pose a threat to Ethan Duster. Don't get me wrong, he's not just a monkey. He's above and beyond all fellow primates. But again, there's no power that George has that Ethan doesn't. Be a good monkey, George, and give up while you still can.

Masha - She may seem like a little kid, but she has the strength to kick a bear mountains away, pull away a train, survive outerspace with no helmet, and literally fly with her arms. Definitely Tier 0 - Moon Level. But it's just her luck that Ethan can do all of those feats as well. "I assume that since you're from Russia, you have a history of communism. So it's not your powers, Masha, it's OUR powers." - Ethan Duster, probably.

Wordgirl - An alien entity that is strong enough to travel faster than the speed of light, stop a meteor the size of a city, manipulating and disobeying the Narrator, who is similar to TOAA by shaping the reality of the show, and grabbing the cutscene's fourth dimensional wall, and straight up bending metal. Being able to defeat even the strongest omnipotent entities is extremely powerful. However, it is important to note that the Narrator is likely following a script, and the whole show is just a one take movie with scripts and fourth wall breakers, and that Ethan can mimic those powers but 10,000x better. Even though she knows every word, she's never heard of the dust of the earth.

Speck of Dust - Speck of Dust is an indestructible being. However, Ethan Duster time travels before Speck of Dust is able to insta-win, and Ethan decides to instantly kill him. In literally every possible and IMPOSSIBLE reality, Ethan Duster wins against all of fiction combined.

Inspector Gadget - Go Go Gadget destroy Ethan. Go Go Gadget commit omniversal genocide. Go Go Gadget become omnipotent. Go Go Gadget create wormhole. Literally anything this guy says becomes true as long as he says, Go Go Gadget. But again, Ethan Duster is immune to any power similar to BEAT ETHAN DUSTER. He technically could say, Go Go Gadget create a contradicted paradox that destroys Ethan's nature and body no matter what, which *might* have an effect on Ethan, but again, it takes a human amount of time to do that. Ethan is the literal brother of God themselves, therefore surpassing Inspector Gadget. Go Go Gadget, self destruct.

Pentajon - Pentajon Quint. The spouse of God, and the close friend of her brother, Ethan Duster. Pentajon Quint is an omnipotent entity who transcends all paradoxes and all logic. Pentajon was strong enough to break the ground, and flick air towards God, causing her to morph into every possible arrangement of atoms in her body, at the speed of light. At the subject

of light, Pentajon surpassed the speed of light with unmeasurable speed. Picoseconds, femtoseconds, attoseconds, zeptoseconds, and yoctoseconds, don't match close to Pentajon's strength. Now the thing about comparing Pentajon to Ethan Duster, is that it's very, interesting. Don't get me wrong, Ethan's powers are unmimickable, yet also able to mimic any character's abilities. But Pentajon was created in Emberville (heaven) long before Ethan. While Ethan did go down onto Aethel (earth) before anyone else besides Willow, Pentajon is the OG. But is Pentajon stronger than Ethan? Well let's see. In terms of strength, speed, intelligence, combat, durability, and energy, Pentajon negs all of those stat factors at a whopping ABSOLUTE INFINITY value. Ethan Duster only reaches 1,000. In terms of who did the most feats? Pentajon negs, once again. Ethan's powers are extremely mimicable when it comes to Pentajon, since Pentajon had all the power before him. But that doesn't necessarily mean that Pentajon is stronger. Remember, Pentajon's maximum potential is absolutely extreme, posing a significant threat to Ethan Duster. Yet he limits himself to only do good. It is genuinely impossible for him to do any sort of unnecessary harm, aka evil. Ethan has definitely sinned multiple times. It's not a good thing to sin, but when you take it so seriously that it limits your power, it has an effect. Even if Pentajon's maximum potential were to somehow be reached, Ethan is already surpassing that level. The thing about Pentajon, is that he not really omnipotent if he even requires and acknowledges strength, speed, etc. Ethan doesn't need that. He surpasses all entities, with or without strength. He doesn't care if there are an infinite amount of infinitely powerful and omnipotent gods coming right at him before the birth of time. Ethan wins, neg diff. People may find it subjective on who's stronger, but Ethan Duster, objectively negs the verse, with no amount of power defeating him. Pentajon is getting his five sides sent back to the 1st dimension.

Sun Wukong - "gUys, sUn WukOng sOIos eThAn dUsTeR beCauSe hE hAs a CoOI sTaff tHat aLLows hIm tO trAnSfOrm iNto anYtHInG (72 things)." Yeah, right. As if a cool monkey who couldn't escape a hand can literally beat the dust of the earth. We don't have to talk about this right now. ETHAN WINS, NEG, DIFF. You may be a king, you may even be a deity, but you are still a monkey!

Steve - I, AM STEVE. CHICKEN JOCKEY. FLINT AND STEEL. First off, Steve is not that strong. "OH BUT HE CAN CARRY A MULTIVERSE WEIGHT OF GOLD-" no he can't. The gold in Minecraft is incredibly weak and not even that heavy. "OH BUT IT'S STILL HEAVY" yes, but there are characters who can carry 50x more than Steve can. "OH BUT HE HAS THE /KILL FEATURE" oh right. The /kill feature? The one that lets you respawn? Surely it's powerful. And SURELY it's a fair fight when you give him special technology. Survival mode Steve struggles to connect to other players worlds. "OH BUT HE CAN TELEPORT WITH ENDER PEARLS" WHEN WE POWERSCALE CHARACTERS, WE DO NOT GIVE THEM EXTRA TECHNOLOGY. AND EVEN IF STEVE COULD DO THIS WITHOUT TECHNOLOGY, HE STILL IS NOT BEATING ETHAN DUSTER. GOT IT? GOOD. HE'LL MINE AND CRAFT THAT GUY APART.

HN: AM - "For 109 years, I've kept you alive, and tortured you. And for 109 years, you've all been asking, 'Why? WHY ME?'" According to the official VS Battles wiki, AM is 10-C. Curious George is 9-C (underrated) which is stronger than AM in that case. AM doesn't even have much abilities rather than being a cool evil AI written in an 11 page book. In all right reality, AM is just scary and evil, but not powerful. While being a great villain, Ethan Duster really negs the guy. "I think, therefore, I AM...GOING TO DESTROY YOU, ALLIED MASTERCOMPUTER." -Ethan, probably.

Chuck Norris - Ah, the classic memified guy who is strong enough to go to a feminism convention and return home with an ironed shirt, and a sandwich. The guy who pushes down the earth while doing pushups. The guy who let the dogs out, the person who asked, and truly the guy who is older than his father. The guy who-alright enough Chuck Norris jokes. In the real world, he is terrible at fighting. In the internet, a god capable of destroying omniverses, and possibly all of fiction. Ethan Duster? Ethan Duster has the power to mimic any power, therefore unfortunately beating Chuck.

I have no joke to put here, unfortunately.

Hyper Sonic - Faster than light apparently. Able to create enough energy to create devastating damage attacks. Can't beat Ethan unfortunately. "Gotta go fast! I have to escape this omnipotent entity that is capable of destroying me completely, erasing me from existence itself!"

Superman - In the comics, Superman punched through the timeline, altering everything. Ethan beats him, since he can create an infinite amount of kryptonite around Superman.
