



Corvallis Elementary Return to On-Campus Instruction Information for Students & Parents/Guardians

Basics

- Masks should be worn by all staff and students at all times.
- All staff and students on site need to have completed a daily health screening.
- No parents or non-staff will be allowed on campus.

Helpful Information to Parents/Guardians

- Students are encouraged to use restroom at home before you leave for school
- Have a big breakfast before coming to school
- Bring a full water bottle
- Fill out daily paper health screening for each child before leaving for school every morning
- Students should dress in warm layers. Classroom doors and windows will be open at all times.

Student Arrival/Drop-Off

Student Self-Screening

Families should conduct a self screening each day. SLz elementary schools will utilize a paper screener. Paper copies will be distributed to all on-campus students on the first day of on-campus instruction. Additional paper copies will be made available at each school entry point and on the school website for printing at home.

The screening includes questions about the student's temperature, potential COVID-19 symptoms, and potential contacts with people who have tested positive for COVID-19. Students who respond "yes" to any question about symptoms or contacts receive an immediate message to stay home.

Arrival at School

We encourage all families to drop their students utilizing the traffic loop. Staff will be available to guide students to their designated areas. Once in the designated area, students will be screened according to the SLzUSD Reopening Plan (mask, sanitize, visual check) as well as confirmation that they have their paper health screening in their hands.

TK-K students will line up outside in the parking lot area in their designated socially distanced lines.

1st graders and all SDC students will line up in the area by the main front doors in their designated socially distanced lines.

2nd-5th grade students will line up by their gate area in their designated socially distanced lines.

Teachers will meet their classes at their lines in front of the school and verify that all students in their line have completed their health screening. Hard copies should be kept by the teacher and turned into the office at the end of the week for record keeping purposes.

If a student is in line, but has not completed the mandatory paper health screening, designated staff members will complete the paper screener with the student. If a pattern develops where students arrive without their health screener, parents/guardians will be contacted to find a solution.



Campus Entry Points

Gate A (Gate attached to parking lot, not street side): Grades TK, Kindergarten

The parking area by Gates A will be closed to all cars. Dots will be on the ground for lining up safely and socially distanced. Students can be dropped off on Corvallis Street in front of the parking lot.



Main Front Doors: Grade 1 and all SDC classes



Wildcat Gate (Gate by cafeteria and Room 3): Grades 2, 3, 4 & 5

The parking area by Gates B will be closed to all cars. Dots will be on the ground for lining up safely and socially distanced. We encourage all parents/guardians to stay in their cars and to use the traffic loop to drop off their student(s).



Entering Campus

Teachers will meet students at their designated areas and walk students to class.

Tardy Students

Any students that are tardy will be directed to GATE B. Staff will be stationed at GATE B and will soft screen (mask, sanitize, visual check) and ensure that digital screening has been completed before walking the student(s) to their classroom.

Rainy Days

Due to space and social distancing constraints there will be no changes for arrival or dismissal for rainy days. Please bring an umbrella and dress accordingly.

Parking

There will be no available parking for parents/guardians at Corvallis (except for handicapped parking). We encourage all parents/guardians to stay in their cars and to use the traffic loop to drop off their student(s).

Bussing

SDC Bussing - Teachers and Paras will meet the bus in the traffic loop and walk students to their classrooms. General Ed Bussing - Students arriving by bus will walk to their designated lines and wait for their teachers.

Dismissal

Students will line up at the same gates in the morning. (Gate A - TK/K, Main Front Doors 1st and all SDC classes, Wildcat Gate - 2nd -5th)

Teachers will walk their students down to their respective lines and wait with students until it is appropriate for them to leave.

Families are asked to use the provided car sign with student name, teacher last name and grade level to display in their cars to facilitate a smoother pick up process. One will be provided to each on-campus student, parents can make extras as needed.

Corvallis staff will announce car arrivals and wait for parents to pick up their students. Older students will be able to join their younger siblings as necessary. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to stay in their cars and to use the loop to pick up their students.

Student Guidelines While On Campus

Physical Distancing

The District will comply with ACPHD and CDPH guidelines regarding minimum physical distancing between students and staff on campus. The District shall ensure physical distancing between students and adults, and adults and adults shall be at least six (6) feet apart in classrooms, workstations and offices. The District will also ensure that classroom configuration for student workspaces shall be at least six (6) feet apart from both other student workspaces and teacher workspace.

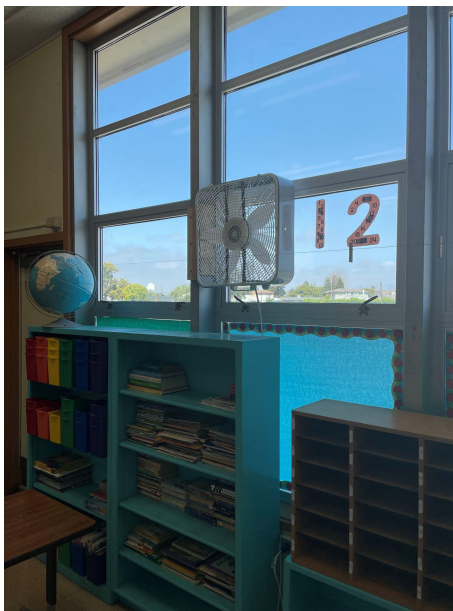


Classrooms

Desks and tables will be set up in classrooms, so that students remain at least 6' apart.

Classrooms will be equipped with:

- MERV 13 filters for the HVAC systems
- Hepa air purifiers
- Venting and circulating fans
- Hand sanitizer



Use of Supplies and Materials

Student supplies and materials should be individualized for each student and the sharing of supplies will be minimized. Please look for guidance from your individual teacher about what they expect each student to bring to class.

Movement Around Campus

Students will walk in the hallway as a class per teacher direction, observing social distancing. This will be taught at the initial return to campus and reinforced as needed. When moving around campus individually or in pairs, students should still continue to observe social distancing, including walking on the right side of the hallway, keeping distance from others as they pass, keeping masks on at all times.



Restroom Use

TK-K students will use their classroom bathrooms.

- 1st - 5th walk to the bathroom on their own
- No more than 2 students in restroom at time and masks should be worn at all times



Food/Drink Policy

No eating will be allowed while on campus (students should eat before and/or after being on campus). Water fountains will not be available for student use. Students should bring their own individual reusable water bottles. Students will not be allowed to drink from their water bottles in the classroom and will be asked to step outside to drink.

Lunch Distribution

2nd - 5th grade student lunches will be distributed as students leave campus at GATE B before lining up for pick up. TK,K,1st grade and all SDC classes will have their lunches delivered to the students in the classroom.

Movement Break Schedule and Guidelines

Students will have the opportunity to play on the playground and play structure. Each class will have its own space on the yard and these will be rotated to provide equal access. Guidelines are as follows:

- Mask wearing, social distancing
- Wash/sanitize hands before and after
- Play structure use OK
- Balls/equipment for each class (no sharing across classes)

Afterschool Care

- Unfortunately, Adventure Time will not be available at Corvallis for services this school year.

Individual Safety Protocols

Mask Wearing

Masks must be worn while on campus, indoors or outdoors. Exceptions for drinking water as appropriate.

Social Distancing

Students and staff should observe social distancing at all times, including walking on the right side of the hallway, keeping distance from others as they pass, keeping masks on at all times. All should restrict the number of people in common areas (office, restrooms, cafeteria, staff room, etc...) to the maximum indicated in each of these areas (signage will be posted).

Hand Washing and Hand Sanitizing

Soap, paper towels, and/or hand sanitizer will be provided in classrooms, as well as in school offices and common areas (such as break rooms). Classroom expectations will include hand washing/sanitizing upon entering and exiting the room and before meals (see food/drink policy below).

Student Illness

The symptoms of COVID-19 are quite wide ranging. Because of that, any student displaying COVID-19 symptoms needs to stay home, and any student who develops symptoms at school needs to be picked up from school immediately. Those symptoms include:

- Fever (100.0 F or more) or chills
- Headache
- Cough
- New loss of taste or smell

- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Sore throat
- Fatigue
- Congestion or runny nose
- Muscle or body aches
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If your child develops these symptoms at school, the teacher will call the office. A staff member will take your child from the classroom to an isolated place, where they will be supervised until picked up. Students - and their siblings - must be picked up within 30 minutes by you or your identified emergency contact.

When the parent arrives to pick up their child, they will be asked to stay in the car, call the office, and wait for the child to be escorted outside. Parents and other visitors are not allowed on campus during this time.

If your child is sent home, our COVID-19 Liaison will follow up with you.

Because of the small size of our cohorts, having one sick student can affect the entire group. SLZUSD nurses have been trained as COVID-19 Liaisons by the Alameda County Public Health Department and will work closely with the department on positive student and staff cases.

Students Who Test Positive for COVID-19

Students who test positive for COVID-19 must stay home, in isolation, for 10 days and their entire cohort - or small group - has to quarantine for 14 days.

Staff will conduct a case investigation, identify classmates or staff who had close contact with the student, and also disinfect the classroom. The class will continue in distance learning until the quarantine period is over. (Source: "COVID-19 School Guidance: Alameda County School Reopening Plans," p. 46.)

Students Who Display Symptoms

Students who display one symptom and have had exposure to someone with COVID-19 will need to remain in isolation until they have been tested or a medical evaluator has sent a letter ruling out COVID-19. The student's cohort will also have to go into quarantine until COVID-19 has been ruled out. The ill student can return to school if s/he is feeling better, has been fever free for 24 hours (without the use of medicine) and a medical evaluator provides a letter saying the symptoms were not due to COVID-19 (Source: "COVID-19 School Guidance: Alameda County School Reopening Plans," p. 45 and 47.)

Students With Close Contact

Students with close contact to a positive case must quarantine for 14 days. We will recommend that your child be tested 4 to 10 days after close contact and that you send the test results to the school. If the test comes back negative, the student still must stay in quarantine for the full 14 days, due to the chance of being infectious or developing symptoms.
