

SIGNS/BANNERS

Purpose

To ground the participants in the Scriptural realities of the events in the room, as well as having the logistical information needed (Emergency Contact and Do Not Disturb signs), and providing visual direction on location for participants and Sunday guests. As the team member responsible for this role, it will be your job to oversee the production and placement of all visual material before and during the sessions.

Way of Being

Alert, exact, diligent.

Mechanics

A. Before the Awaken

1. Ask the Sponsor or Coach who you can call who has previously been the Signs & Visuals person (even from Awaken trainings were elsewhere) to ground on details of this job.
2. Personally view the two main sig banners four weeks prior to the training to ensure that no signs are missing, and that all are in good condition. Depending on your region, ask your Sponsor if these signs are already available from a previous local sponsor and still do your due diligence in picking them up early to check them ahead of time. Check for flaws or damage — don't assume all will be well. Make repairs, if needed.
3. Coordinate with the Sponsor about the directional signs needed to find the location and/or training room. No participant or Sunday guest should need to guess where they are going once they arrive at the location. Any directional signs will need to be typed and laminate so as to display them in the most professional manner (including no tape showing where they are hung/taped).
4. Be aware of the large investment in all materials and treat them with utmost care. Handle all materials in a way that they will be preserved.
5. Put up or hang all signs the night before during set up.
6. Talk to your Sponsor or Team Captain about who the Emergency Contact number will be and print three signs to place on the two outer training room doors (or possibly one on the participant entrance door to the training room, and the other on the nametag/water station table if there is room... as long as they are visible to participants), and the third can be placed in the training room and taped on the corner of the team table in the back closest to the exit door.
7. Create signs that say: "DO NOT DISTURB AT ANY TIME. TRAINING IN PROGRESS." For every exit door including ones that might be on the opposite walls of the exit doors but can still be accessed from the outside or from outer room hallways.

B. During the Awaken

1. Request help making new signs if needed and keeping the room balanced visually.

C. After the Awaken

1. Return all material to its appropriate place. If you borrowed banners from a local Sponsor or from GAP, please do not rely on them to take them home from the training, but return it to them or delegate it to someone to return those to them ASAP where you picked them up.
2. Make sure all material is packaged and stored safely so as to preserve quality.
