Matan Field showed how he cooks up a DAO from scratch, presentations by Olivier Sarrouy from the <u>Ryhope network on Pando</u>. <u>Clément Lesaege</u> introduced us to <u>Kleros</u> and put a lot of <u>Doges on trial</u>. <u>Horatii Partners</u> unveiled their concept for a DAO Incubator and last but not least, the Genesis Alpha DAO pollinators shared their experiences, hopes and dreams in panel format.

How to DAO #2 happened inside the confines of the Web3 summit bringing together an impressive panel of debaters for what turned out to be a heated (and yet amicable)

discussion. Captured in video, audio and as a Graphic Recording by pollinator Felipe Duarte from <u>Dupluswie</u> and planned collectively between Cem Dagdelen and Daniel Shavit from <u>Horatii Partners</u> and Kate Beecroft and Francesca Pick from <u>Greatherthan</u>, our five strong panel were joined by an attentive and participant audience crammed in the Node 10 of the hackerspace for 1h30. We realized it's time to act!
