In addition to their rented instrument and materials, all students should have the following items:

- ½" Black Binder with clear sleeve on front and at least 10 clear plastic sheet protectors - Sound Innovations for Concert Band, Bk 1: A Revolutionary Method for Beginning Musicians | Written by Peter Boonshaft, Bob Phillips, Dave Black, et al. (**buy YOUR instrument's book**)
- Pencils, pencils, and more pencils
- A name tag / luggage tag for your instrument case

The following equipment is optional, but can be helpful to have throughout your band journey:

- Music stand (for at home practice | does not need to be brought to school)
- A metronome and tuner:
 - The Tonal Energy app is recommended for students that have phones (available for iOS and Android). There are plenty of free metronomes and tuning apps that would work as well. - However, these apps would only be used for home practice. Students can use a combo metronome/tuner like the Korg TM60 for in class/home use if they prefer to buy a physical tuner.
 - A stand for your instrument:
 - Several companies make stands that hold your instrument in a safe position when not in use. These can be very helpful for constantly having your instrument out at home, as well as for quickly setting it down in school rehearsals

- A small tote bag / sack for carrying smaller instruments, binder, instrument accessories, etc
(clarinet and flute find these to be very helpful)
