This July 13-19, high school students are invited to join Close Up, the Deliberative Democracy Lab at Stanford University (DDL), and the Crowdsourced Democracy Team at Stanford Engineering for NextGen Roundtable: Al & Democracy Summer Institute on the Stanford campus. Building on the deliberative practices of last summer's America in One Room: The Youth Vote, students will explore how rapid changes in technology and Al impact education, the environment, the economy, and our democracy and elections. Hearing from tech innovators, academics, and advocates, students will evaluate a variety of policies at the intersection of tech and society, produce a youth report on their own recommendations, and have the chance to earn a Certification in Civil Discourse through Close Up and DDL.

Joaquin Bustoz Math-Science Honors Program

Eligibility Requirements:

- High school sophomore, junior or senior
- Cumulative 3.25 GPA (unweighted)

- Minimum of **three** years of high school level math courses completed by May 2025 (this includes taking algebra in middle school)
- Graduating seniors: accepted to ASU and plan to attend ASU during the fall 2025 semester
- Qualify for Arizona in-state tuition (based on Arizona Board of Regents guidelines).
- Must have lived in Arizona for the last 2 years
- Application Deadline: February 22nd, 2025

A selection committee reviews all complete applications. Participants are selected on the basis of academic achievement, letter of recommendation, and personal/career statement. Special consideration is given to students who are first-generation college-bound. Statewide representation is also a consideration in student selection.

ANYTOWN is a nationally recognized, award winning leadership and social justice program for youth ages 14-19. Every year, we bring diverse groups of Arizona high school students together for a weeklong residential learning experience. Through interactive workshops, simulations and discussions, participants explore topics like prejudice, discrimination and bias. Anytown

addresses widespread cultural competence gaps by educating young leaders about the value of diversity and inclusion and teaching participants to recognize and counter stereotypes and bullying.

Our approach to creating change can be summed up in three words: understanding through sharing. Anytown is the only program of its kind, intentionally bringing together unlike teenagers with diverse beliefs and backgrounds to learn appropriate and effective methods of discussing difficult topics such as racism, sexism, homophobia, transphobia, classism, ableism and more. Anytown changes hearts and minds by bringing diverse people together to engage in respectful, productive dialogue – an essential step in moving past conflict and division.
