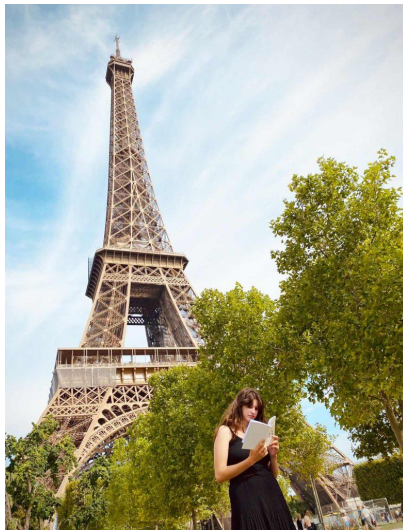

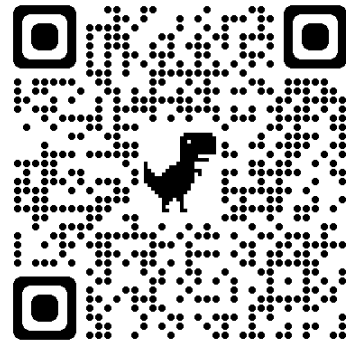

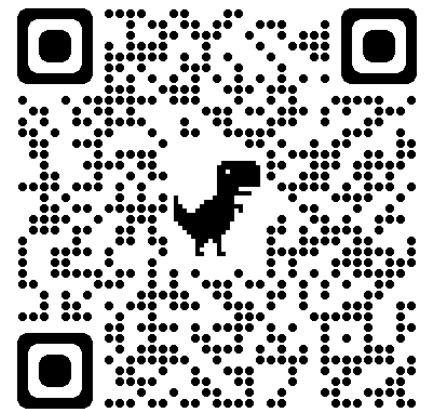

Close Up: NEXTGEN ROUNDTABLE: AI & DEMOCRACY SUMMER CAMP

This July 13-19, high school students are invited to join Close Up, the Deliberative Democracy Lab at Stanford University (DDL), and the Crowdsourced Democracy Team at Stanford Engineering for NextGen Roundtable: AI & Democracy Summer Institute on the Stanford campus. Building on the deliberative practices of last summer's America in One Room: The Youth Vote, students will explore how rapid changes in technology and AI impact education, the environment, the economy, and our democracy and elections. Hearing from tech innovators, academics, and advocates, students will evaluate a variety of policies at the intersection of tech and society, produce a youth report on their own recommendations, and have the chance to earn a Certification in Civil Discourse through Close Up and DDL.

Joaquin Bustoz Math-Science Honors Program

Eligibility Requirements:

- High school sophomore, junior or senior
- Cumulative 3.25 GPA (unweighted)
- "A" or "B" grades in high school math and science courses
- Minimum of **three** years of high school level math courses completed by May 2025 (this includes taking algebra in middle school)
- Graduating seniors: accepted to ASU and plan to attend ASU during the fall 2025 semester
- Qualify for Arizona in-state tuition (based on Arizona Board of Regents guidelines).
- Must have lived in Arizona for the last 2 years
- Application Deadline: February 22nd, 2025

A selection committee reviews all complete applications. Participants are selected on the basis of academic achievement, letter of recommendation, and personal/career statement.

Special consideration is given to students who are first-generation college-bound. Statewide representation is also a consideration in student selection.

Anytown Leadership Camp

ANYTOWN is a nationally recognized, award winning leadership and social justice program for youth ages 14-19. Every year, we bring diverse groups of Arizona high school students together for a weeklong residential learning experience. Through interactive workshops, simulations and discussions, participants explore topics like prejudice, discrimination and bias. Anytown addresses widespread cultural competence gaps by educating young leaders about the value of diversity and inclusion and teaching participants to recognize and counter stereotypes and bullying.

Our approach to creating change can be summed up in three words: understanding through sharing. Anytown is the only program of its kind, intentionally bringing together unlike teenagers with diverse beliefs and backgrounds to learn appropriate and effective methods of discussing

difficult topics such as racism, sexism, homophobia, transphobia, classism, ableism and more. Anytown changes hearts and minds by bringing diverse people together to engage in respectful, productive dialogue – an essential step in moving past conflict and division.

By advancing those conversations, we build and nurture empathy and understanding. Teens who experience Anytown Leadership Camp leave the program equipped with the tools to increase their ability to foster inclusion and respect among all members of society.

Rosetta institute of Biomedical Research

The [Rosetta Institute of Biomedical Research](#) is excited to announce our Summer 2026 workshop sessions, and we are now accepting applications! These programs are designed for high-achieving middle and high school students who are exploring careers in medicine, research and other STEM fields, and who want to learn college-level material, be taught by PhD- and MD-level scientists, and STAND OUT in the college admissions process.

Why Rosetta?

Our workshops immerse students in cutting-edge molecular and cellular biology through engaging lectures, real-world labs, and independent projects. Our instructors are actively involved in medical research and help students connect what they learn to real diseases and therapies. Participants meet motivated peers from around the world, strengthen their academic and lab skills, build a strong college portfolio, and—at our residential programs—experience college dorm life in a safe, well-supervised environment.

We offer workshops during both winter break and summer in online and in-person formats. Our in-person workshops include AI-Enhanced Bioinformatics, Developmental Biology, Molecular Neuroscience, Molecular Biology of Cancer, Molecular Immunology, Molecular Biology of Aging, Cancer Bioinformatics with R, Biomedical Research, and several topic-specific Bioinformatics workshops (Neurologic, Immunologic, Cancer, Aging). Our online workshops include Medicinal Chemistry, FutureMD: Oncology, Medical Bioinformatics, and Introduction to Cellular and Molecular Medicine.

Summer 2026 Workshops (online, residential, commuter):

During Summer 2026 we offer in-person workshops at UC Berkeley, UC San Diego, Columbia University, and University College London (with both residential and a limited number of commuter spots), as well as commuter-only workshops at our facility in the Bay Area, CA.

At the universities, our two-week residential programs include Molecular Biology of Cancer, Molecular Neuroscience, Developmental Biology, Molecular Immunology, Molecular Biology of Aging, and Bioinformatics workshops with several emphases (R Programming, AI-Enhanced, Cancer, Neurologic, Immunologic, Aging). Students live in undergraduate dorms, eat in campus dining facilities, and are supervised 24/7 by instructors, teaching assistants, and residential advisors, gaining a safe and structured introduction to college life while exploring four of the world's leading universities.

Summer dates are as follows:

UC Berkeley sessions run 5/31–6/13 and 6/14–6/27

UC San Diego runs 7/5–7/18

Columbia University runs 7/19–8/1

University College London runs 8/3–8/15

We also offer the lab-intensive Biomedical Research workshop at our Bay Area facility from 6/16–6/26 and 8/4–8/14. These workshops are commuter-only, so students traveling from outside the area would need to arrange their own accommodations.

Our **online Summer 2026 offerings** include two evening sessions (2 hrs/day from 5/18–5/29) of our new FutureMD workshop, a virtual shadowing experience that follows a physician's day-to-day life in one of several specialties; the inaugural session focuses on Oncology. We will also run three sessions (morning, afternoon, and evening) of Intro to Cellular and Molecular Medicine from 6/8–6/19 (2 hrs/day, M–F), two sessions of Medicinal Chemistry from 7/6–7/17 (AM and PM, 3 hrs/day, M–F), and two sessions of Medical Bioinformatics from 6/22–7/3 and 8/3–8/14 (5.5 hrs/day). During winter break we offer Medical Bioinformatics and Medicinal Chemistry online, as well as Biomedical Research and Cancer Research at our facilities in Alameda and Berkeley, CA respectively, giving students additional opportunities to deepen their interest in medicine during the school year. 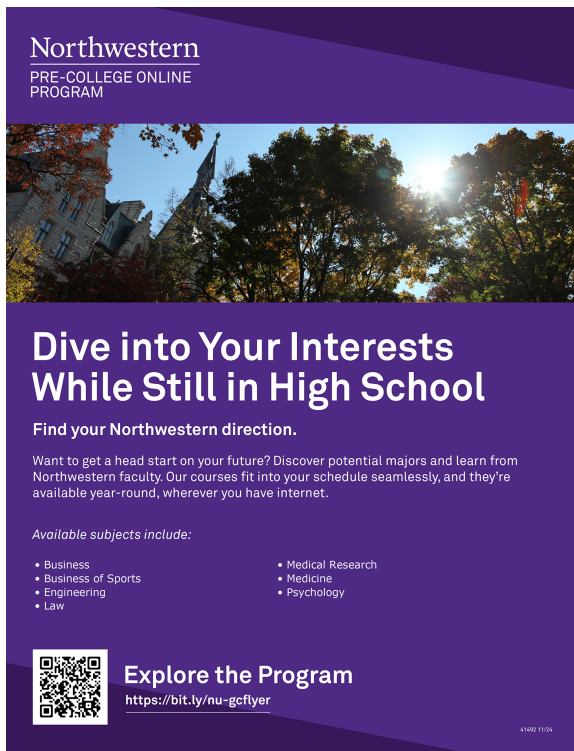

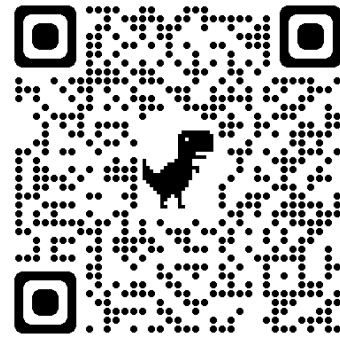
