- 4. Choose one:
 - **a. Complete your script**. Your script must be typed (MLA format). Submit your script <u>on Google Classroom.</u> *If you do not have your script completed prior to your POL, you will not be allowed to present.*
 - **b. Create your Digital Presentation-** Submit your digital presentation <u>on Google Classroom.</u> *If you do not have your digital presentation completed prior to your POL, you will not be allowed to present.*
- 5. Review the potential questions you could be asked during your POL. Familiarize with POL policies (below).
- **PRACTICE!** In front of your parents, relatives, friends, classmates, loved ones, pets, anyone who will watch you. You can also record yourself presenting, watch the footage, and give yourself feedback. Use the feedback sheet to record your audience's thoughts on your presentation.

POL Details and Policies

- 1. Every student <u>presents a defense for each of their subjects</u> that uses <u>concrete evidence</u>.
- 2. Every student <u>creates a digital presentation that uses minimal amounts of text</u> (PowerPoint, Keynote, Prezi, etc.).
- 3. Refer to the common, comprehensive, longitudinal GoogleSheets Rubric for the panel's scores and feedback.
- 4. The final defense score is an aggregate of individual subject scores.
- 5. A student may pass their overall POL even if they do not pass an individual subject.
- 6. Q&A time consists of one clarification/application question without leading questions or commentary.
- 7. The defense may be used by students as a final opportunity to demonstrate mastery in one essential skill per course.
- 8. **Missed Presentation Policy:** You will receive a zero until represent (panel of teachers + additional staff member). Highest score is a 1 on overall POL. Individual EKS mastery may be adjusted at teacher's discretion. * Valid reasons for a missed POL include doctor's appointments with doctor's note and parent confirmation, hospital visits with appropriate documentation and parent confirmation, and deaths in the family with appropriate documentation and parent confirmation.
- 9. Unprepared Policy (Lack of Professional Attire or Missing a Script): Unpreparedness will be reflected in a student's irrevocable accountability score.
- **10. POL Makeup Policy:** Students who presented at the date and time originally scheduled but did not pass on the first attempt may make one makeup presentation per content area.. Makeups will be scheduled during the first available slot for the panel. A failing grade during a makeup results in a failing transcript grade. The deadline for make ups is the last day of the se
