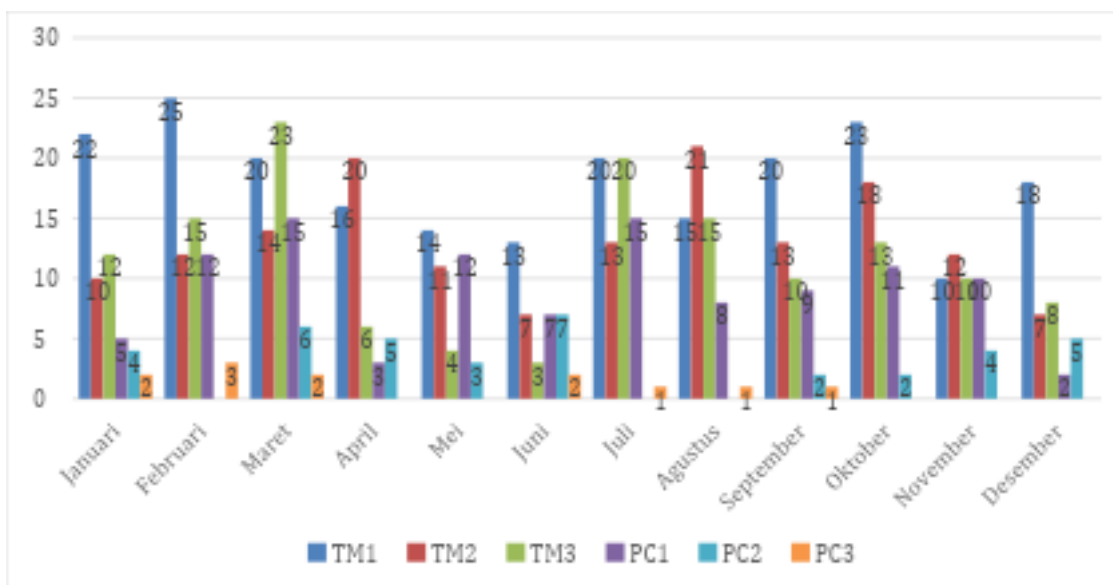


Figure 1. Data on Employee Attendance in the 2019 Academic Year (Garamond, size 12, bold, centered)
