	information. Otherwise, car transportation downtown is
	reasonable and efficient. However, bus, light rail, and
	bike exclusive streets incentivize the use of alternative
	modes of transit.
	Metro Transit's Blue Line is efficient and, in many cases,
	faster for travelling from the airport to downtown. The
	Blue Line's efficiency makes it easy for attendees to
	reach the venue if we are able to host Mysterium
	downtown. For attendees travelling by bus, the
	Hawthorne Transportation Center is located downtown
	and connected to the Skyway.
	While one other light rail line exists (Green), Metro
	Transit's other options are limited to (an actively
	expanding) BRT system and local bus routes. Currently
	available BRT routes include Red, A, and C. While A
	provides flexibility for connecting from Blue to Green
	lines without travelling to U.S. Bank Stadium Station,
	introducing transfers will raise complexity for attendees
	and should be avoided. Locals have expressed
	,

frustrations with local bus routes when connecting from suburbs to central transit routes.

St. Paul makes for a tempting alternative to downtown Minneapolis. This temptation is marred by the distance and time required to travel on the Green Line to reach the Core district (about 35 minutes from U.S. Bank Station to Central Station). However, the Green Line is an effective method for attendees traveling by Amtrak looking to reach Minneapolis.

Minneapolis is a generally affordable city with approachable dining, entertainment, and travel. Airfare is typically low cost.

Parking is available on ramps and lots around downtown for varying rates and may be negotiable with the hotel of choice, if cost is levied at the property.
