- 9. How do I get permission to use someone else's work?

Most authors, artists, photographers, composers have an email that isn't too hard to find. Emailing and asking for permission is the best way to start. This is a great opportunity for students to practice authentic writing and to understand that there are actual people behind all of these works. Many artists will get back to you quickly.
