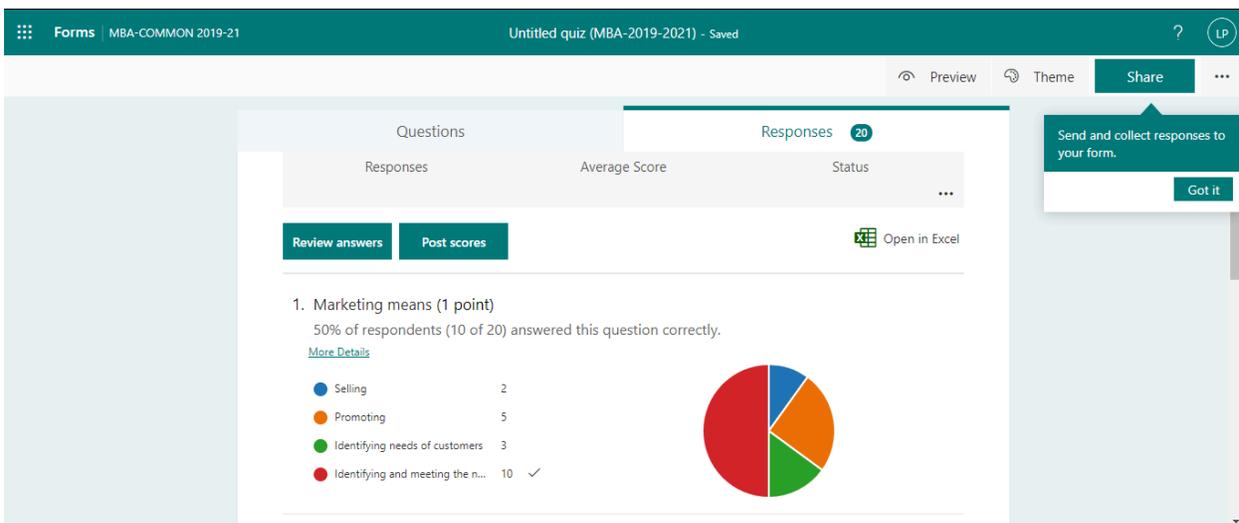

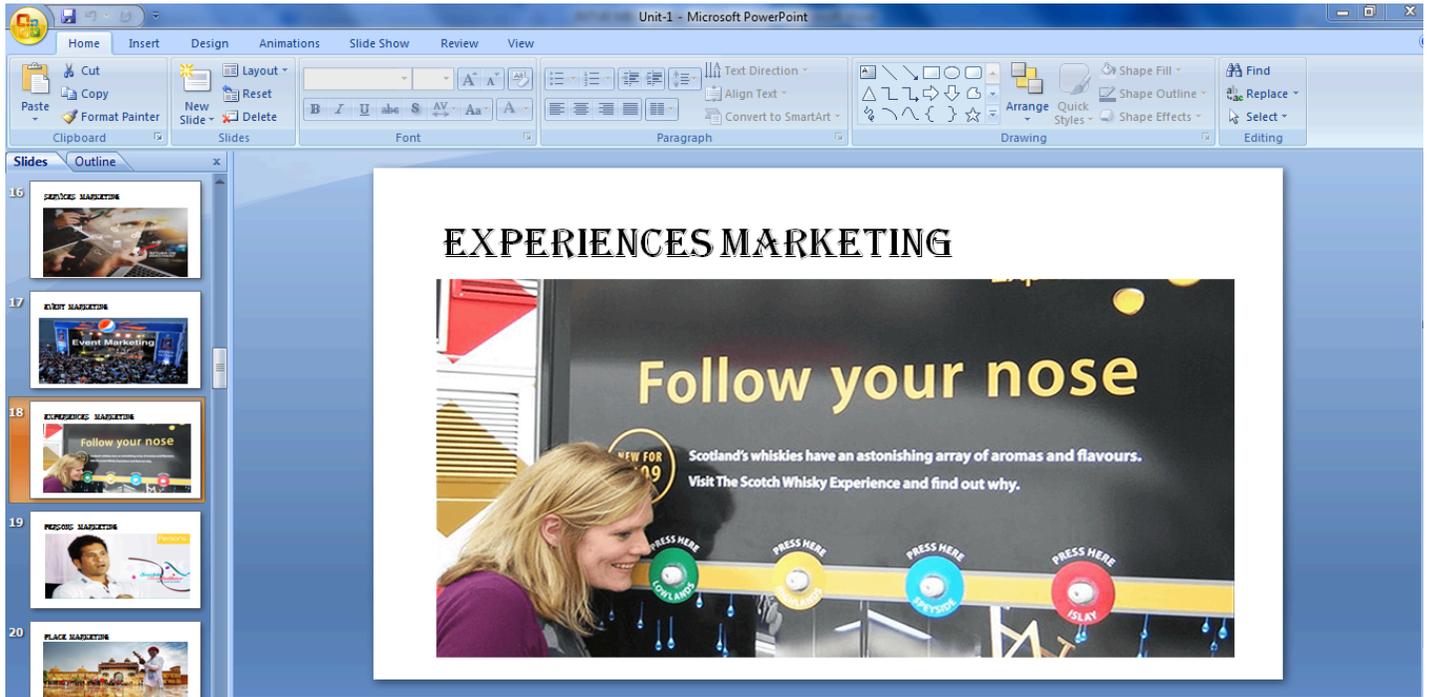


Fig:1 Slide representing that how Experiences are being Marketed

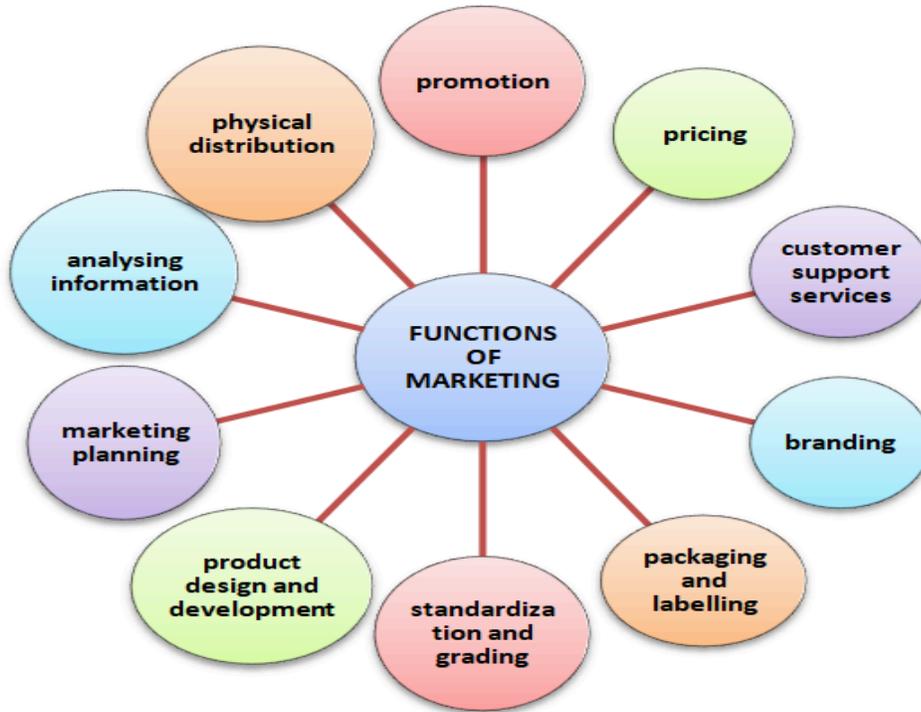


Fig: 3 Diagram representing different functions of Marketing

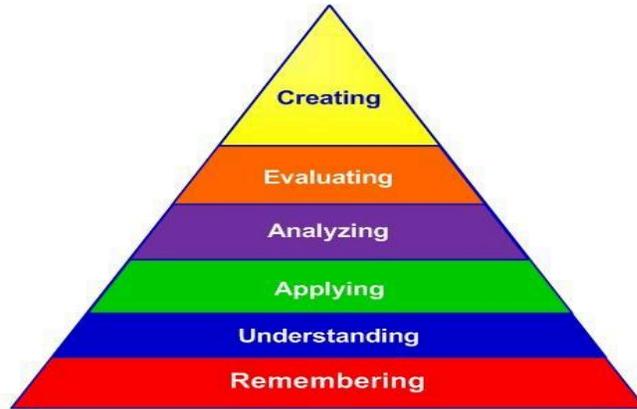
