Curriculum by Grade and Quarter(s):

6th Grade

Quarter 1 & 2 (17 hours)

Unit 1: ¿Por qué es importante ser bilingüe?

In this unit, students will learn how being bilingual will give them opportunities to participate in the global community in more ways, get information from more places, and learn more about people from other cultures. They will also develop or maintain strong ties to their family, culture, and community, which are important parts of their developing identity.

Quarter 3 & 4 (21 hours)

Quarters 1 & 2
