Principal's Award

Purpose

The Principal's Award is to recognize students' academic achievement in Grades 4-6

Award Criteria

Students must have an overall average of A+ (minimum 95%) & receive G or E in all Learning Skills and Work Habits.



Eligibility

Current Abraar School students in Grades 4-6.

Recognition

The Principal Award recipient will be acknowledged at the Annual Award Ceremony. The recipient will be presented with a trophy at the Annual Awards Ceremony.

Honor Roll

Purpose

The Honor Roll Award is to recognize students' academic achievement in Grades 4-6.

Award Criteria

Students must have an overall average of A- (minimum 80%) and receive G or E in all Learning Skills and Work Habits.

Eligibility

Current Abraar School students in Grades 4-6.

Recognition

The Honor Roll Award recipient will be acknowledged at the Annual Award Ceremony. The recipient will be presented with a medal at the Annual Awards Ceremony.



Emerging Leader Award

Purpose

The Emerging Leader Award is designed to recognize students' leadership achievements in Grades 5-6. The recipient will represent the positive attributes of student leadership and will have contributed to a positive learning school environment.

Award Criteria

Applicants must be able to showcase their personal or group actions which have positively affected student life. Ideal candidates have contributed to the enrichment of the campus community and have demonstrated the following traits:

Ability to motivate self & others / Creativity /Collaboration /Integrity /Balance

Eligibility

Current Abraar School students in Grades 5-6 in good academic standing; a minimum of B average (minimum 73%) in all subjects and receive a G or E in Responsibility, Initiative and Collaboration in Learning Skills and Work Habits and no "N or S" in any of the Learning Skills and Work Habits. They also need to demonstrate a leadership role in at least one school wide initiative/activity or participate in the student council.

Recognition

The Emerging Leader Award recipient will be acknowledged at the Annual Award Ceremony. The recipient will be presented with a trophy at the Annual Awards Ceremony.

Art Award

Purpose

The Art Award honors students in grades 4-6 who have demonstrated exemplary skills in Art class at Abraar School.

Award Criteria

Students must receive an A+ in Art.

Eligibility

Students in Grades 4-6.

Recognition

The recipient of the Art Award will be acknowledged at the Annual Award Ceremony. The recipient will be presented with a certificate.

Continuous Effort Award

Purpose

The Continuous Effort Award honors students in grades 4-6 who have demonstrated growth in their academics and Learning Skills and Work Habits.

Award Criteria

Students must have evidence of improved growth on one level to the next in a minimum of 5 subjects and 3 learning skills.

Eligibility

Students in Grades 4-6.

Recognition

The recipient of the Continuous Effort Award will be acknowledged through a certificate given with the report card.

Annual Quran Competition

Purpose

The Annual Quran competition provides an opportunity for students to demonstrate their recitation and memorization skills in the Quran. Judges from outside are invited to judge the students competing in the competition.

Award Criteria

Focuses on tajweed, recitation, and memorization.

Eligibility

Students in JK to Grade 6.

Recognition

First and second place winners from each grade level will be recognized during the competition.

Beaver Computing Challenge

Purpose

<u>The BCC</u> is a problem-solving contest with a focus on computational and logical thinking. BCC is organized by the University of Waterloo that involves logical thinking and computation.



Students have the chance to compete against other Grade 5 and 6 students from across Canada.

Award Criteria

Students scoring in the top 25% on the test receive a Certificate of Distinction from the University of Waterloo

Eligibility

Students in Grade 5-6

Recognition

The names of some of the top-scoring participants among all those participating in the challenge are posted online on the University's website. Students receive the certificate of distinction during a school assembly.
