



About My Child's Diabetes:

My child has Type 1 Diabetes, an autoimmune disorder that makes them insulin dependent. That means they need insulin with all food, and we have to monitor them to be sure that their blood sugar is in a safe range.

When my child is low, they:

- Complain that they are hot
- Act very tired and lethargic
- Are not able to focus well
- Appear very pale

If you see these symptoms, please check their blood sugar!

• A safe blood sugar is between 80-180. We are more concerned with lows. If they are below 80, **they must eat** [*insert child's best low supply*] immediately. **You do not need to check in with parents before you treat a low.** Recheck their sugar after 15 minutes to be sure that they have come back into range. If they have not, please give more [*low supply*]. Please also call parents/guardians if you are treating for a low.



• If my child is over 200, please enter their blood sugar into the pump to see if there is a correction. If the CGM is reading HIGH, please contact me.

• My child is wearing a **XX-brand pump** and a **XX Continuous Glucose Monitor (CGM)** that allows me to always read their blood sugar through an app.
