What is so special about Winter Geocaching?

SB:

- Having the seasons change is awesome. It's a whole different game in the winter
- The woods look spectacular after a snowfall
- More clothing means more pockets!

CC:

- What's so special about it? Well in a lot of places all the undergrowth has died
 off, making cache access easy, until it snows if you live in a snowy area. I
 haven't cache a lot in snow, but I have cached in snow a small handful of times,
 but some relatively easy stuff.
- You may even need a jacket.
- Snakes are dormant, YEAH!

SK:

- I love the peace and quiet of the woods after a fresh snowfall.
- Winter can make that tough 5/5 island cache an easy 1/1 walkup!

Winter Geocache Preparation - finding and hiding

SB:

- Consider the changes of the seasons and how they interact with geocache hides
- Snow, Ice and Flood issues

- Foliage disappears
- Know how high to hide your geocache
 - Heavy snow and ice can trap a geocache Move them upwards as an option?
- Disable the geocache as an option or use the Winter Attribute
- Freezing weather can freeze and break certain things within a geocache

CC:

- I'm sure plows can make the simple LPC a real challenge.
- It may also make getting a cache hidden high on a lamp with a magnet, that much easier.
- Or access to an Island cache a walk in the park, or across the ice.

SK:

- Pico tubes or containers made of similar plastic are not a good idea in areas that get very cold - they tend to crack and break.
- Caches should be rated based on when it is hidden, so keep that in mind when finding a cache in the winter.
- I always have extra logs with me in the winter to replace ones that have frozen.
- Dress in layers!
- Walking in snow is exhausting, even with snowshoes.
- Definitely bring extra batteries, since the cold can make your phone battery die much quicker.
- Follow the footprints!

Winterizing Maintenance

SB:

- Things get wet, moist and frozen
- Pens can freeze
- Containers can become brittle
- Lids can stick (metal)

CC:

- I never really have winterized a cache. The lowest temp my caches have ever seen was about 28F (or -2C.) Never had an issue with pens at those temps but I can see how that can be a problem.
- I'd say for around here, making sure it's well water tight would be a winterizing need.

SK:

What changes do you make to your backpack, car, etc?

SB:

- Add a rubber mallet to my trunk
- Add extra gloves to my bag and car

CC:

- Snow chains, if I'm heading up in the mountains, even if the roads are currently clear.
- For me this is when I check my winter gear (blanket, ice scraper, gloves, etc) to make sure things are in good condition before heading up into mountain areas.
 Things do deteriorate over time. Especially when stuck in the trunk, boot, hatch, ... of a car during long hot summers.

SK:

- Here in the midwest, winters can get very very cold. That doesn't necessarily stop be from caching - I just cache differently.
- I always carry a blanket in the car, even in the summer. In winter, I add some waters and snacks, just in case.
