Athletic Shoes for Physical Education

Students must have one pair of athletic shoes that can be left at school for use during physical education classes. Improper shoes can cause shin splints and injury to the students or others if they come off while kicking or running. The shoe must be secured by laces, Velcro straps, or elastic to prevent it from falling off during active play. Mary Jane-style or slip-on loafer-style shoes do not provide support, traction, or protection to the feet and ankles.
